21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY	OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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23	SECTION 1. (a) There is establ	ished a commission to be known as the
24	"The Commission on Closing the Achieve	ment Gap in Arkansas".
25	(b) The commission shall consis	t of twelve (12) members as follows:
26	(1)(A) Three (3) persons	appointed by the Governor;
27	(B) One (1) of the	Governor's appointees shall be a member
28	of the faculty of a historically black	college in the state; and
29	(C) One (1) of the	Governor's appointees shall be a
30	minority who has demonstrated a commit	ment to education;
31	(2)(A) Three (3) persons	appointed the President Pro Tempore of
32	the Senate;	
33	(B) One (1) of the	President Pro Tem pore's appointees
34	shall be a member of the faculty of a	historically black college in the
35	state; and	
36	(C) One (1) of the	President Pro Tem pore's appointees

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1	shall be a minority who has demonstrated a commitment to education;	
2	(3)(A) Three (3) persons appointed by the Speaker of the House	
3	of Representatives;	
4	(B) One (1) of the Speaker of the House of	
5	Representatives' appointees shall be a Hispanic person; and	
6	(C) One (1) of the Speaker of the House of	
7	Representatives' appointees shall be a minority who has demonstrated a	
8	commitment to education; and	
9	(4) Three (3) persons appointed by the Black Caucus of the	
10	General Assembly.	
11	(c) The appointed commission members shall be residents of the State	
12	of Arkansas at the time of appointment and throughout their terms.	
13	(d)(1) In 2003, three (3) members shall be appointed by the Speaker of	
14	the House of Representatives as follows:	
15	(A) One (1) for a term to expire June 30, 2005;	
16	(B) One (1) for a term to expire June 30, 2006; and	
17	(C) One (1) for a term to expire June 30, 2007; and	
18	(2) In 2003, three (3) members shall be appointed by the	
19	President Pro Tempore of the Senate as follows:	
20	(A) One (1) for a term to expire June 30, 2005;	
21	(B) One (1) for a term to expire June 30, 2006; and	
22	(C) One (1) for a term to expire June 30, 2007; and	
23	(3) In 2003, three (3) members shall be appointed by the	
24	Governor as follows:	
25	(A) One (1) for a term to expire June 30, 2005;	
26	(B) One (1) for a term to expire June 30, 2006; and	
27	(C) One (1) for a term to expire June 30, 2007; and	
28	(4) In 2003, three (3) members shall be appointed by the Black

33	(5) Subsequent appointments are for a term of four (4) years.	
34	(e)(1) If a vacancy occurs in an appointed position, for any reason,	
35	the vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.	
36	(2) The new appointee shall serve for the remainder of the	

1	unexpired term.
2	(f) The Black Caucus shall designate one of its appointees to serve as
3	chairperson.
4	(g)(1) The commission shall meet at times and places the chairperson
5	deems necessary, but no less than four (4) times per calendar year.
6	(2) No meetings shall be held outside of the State of Arkansas.
7	(3) A majority of the members of the commission shall constitute
8	a quorum for the purpose of transacting business.
9	(4) All action of the commission shall be by a majority vote of
10	the full membership of the commission.
11	(h) The commission shall:
12	(1) Monitor the Department of Education's single, statewide
13	accountability plan, and make recommended changes to the plan to ensure that
14	all schools and districts make adequate yearly progress in raising the
15	academic achievement of:
16	(A) Economically disadvantaged students; and
17	(B) Students from major racial and ethnic groups; and
18	(2)(A) Monitor the Department of Education efforts to comply
19	with federal guidelines on improving the academic achievement of the
20	disadvantaged, specifically including but not limited to the No Child Left
21	Behind Act.
22	(B) Monitor the Department of Education identification of
23	population groups to be motivated in closing the achievement gap efforts.
24	(C) The commission may expand the role and scope of the
25	commission to cover specific population groups as identified by the
26	Department of Education as target groups for closing the achievement gaps;
27	<u>and</u>
28	(3) File a report with the chairpersons of the House and Senate
29	Interim Committees on Education, the Governor and the State Board of
30	Education no later than November 1 of each year.
31	(i)(1) The Department of Education shall provide staff and office
32	space to the commission.
33	(2)(A) Members of the commission shall serve without pay.
34	(B) Members of the commission may receive expense
35	reimbursement in accordance with Arkansas Code § 25-16-902, to be paid by the
36	Department of Education to the extent money is available.

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2	SECTION 2. Students who have been placed at risk of academic failure;	
3	Personal education plans.	
4	(a)(1) Local school districts shall implement an academic improvement	
5	plan with focused intervention and performance benchmarks in accordance with	
6	the rules and regulations developed by the State Board of Education.	
7	(2) Identification shall occur as early as can reasonably be	
8	done and can be based on grades, observations, and other factors that	
9	teachers and administrators consider appropriate, without having	
10	to await the results of state-mandated assessments.	
11	(b)(1) At the beginning of the school year an academic achievement	
12	plan shall be developed for any student not performing at grade level, as	
13	identified by state-mandated assessments.	
14	(2) If a student's performance appears to be falling below state	
15	proficiency standards at any time during the school year, an academic	
16	improvement plan shall be developed.	
17	(c) Focused intervention and acceleration activities may include,	
18	among other things, summer school, Saturday school, and extended days.	
19	(d) Local school districts shall provide the activities identified in	
20	subdivision (c) of this section, and transportation, free of charge to	
21	students.	
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23	SECTION 3. Establishment of Local Task Forces on Closing the	
24	Achievement Gap.	
25	(a)(1) The State Board of Education shall adopt a policy for local	
26	school district to establish local task forces on closing the achievement	
27	gap.	
28	(2) The purpose of each task force is to advise and work with	
29	its local board of directors and administration on closing the gap in	
30	academic achievement and on developing a collaborative plan for achieving	
31	that goal.	
32	(b) The policy shall include the following:	
33	(1) Each task force shall report to its local board of	
34	directors;	
35	(2) Each task force shall include key stakeholders in the	
36	community who are committed to improving the education of all children,	

- 1 especially those who are underachieving, and who agree to attend, on a 2 regular basis, task force meetings, take an active role in discussions and 3 activities, listen to the ideas, suggestions, and comments of other task force members as well as community members, inform other members of the 4 5 school and community of the work of the task force, participate in any 6 training for the task force members such as consensus building, problem-7 solving, and group dynamics, and seek actively data-driven solutions to 8 improving the achievement of all students; and 9 (3) Task force members shall be representative of community 10 demographics, race, ethnic, gender, and socio-economic diversity, and it is 11 strongly recommended that they include: 12 (A)(i) Three (3) parents, as selected by the local school 13 district's parent organization. 14 (ii) One (1) parent who has a child at an elementary 15 school, one (1) who has a child at a junior high or middle school, and one 16 (1) who has a child at a high school; 17 (B) School administrators, teachers, instructional support personnel, exceptional children personnel, and second language specialists, 18 19 each of whom shall be selected by the superintendent; 20 (C) One (1) member of the local board of education, as 21 selected by that board; 22 (D) One (1) representative of the local department of 23 social services; 24 (E) At least one (1) juvenile court counselor;
- 25 (F) At least one (1) representative of local law
- 26 enforcement;
- 27 (G) One (1) representative of the local Communities in
- 28 Schools program, if present in the local school district, as selected by the
- 29 executive director of that program;
- 30 (H) At least one (1) representative of local businesses,
- as selected by the local chamber of commerce; 31
- 32 (I) Representatives from community-based organizations, as
- 33 selected by the superintendent upon recommendation from those organizations;
- 34 (J) At least one (1) representative of a university school
- 35 of education, if there is one in the area, as selected by the chairperson of
- 36 the local board of education;

1	(K) Two (2) high school students, as recommended by their
2	student councils and elected by the chairperson of the local board of
3	education; and
4	(L) Any other community representatives, as selected by
5	the superintendent.
6	(c) The superintendent shall name the chair of the task force, who
7	shall call the first meeting of the task force.
8	(d) Each task force shall:
9	(1) Decide on training that it may need;
10	(2) Determine what information and data the task force will
11	need, plan and schedule presentations on the information and data, which
12	shall be disaggregated by race, ethnicity, gender, and socio-economic status.
13	Examples may include state test data, discipline statistics, teacher-student
14	ratio, student and teacher attendance data, faculty composition by race,
15	gender, and ethnicity, and professional preparation of educators;
16	(3) Define the communication process and person responsible for
17	disseminating information to the public. Communication shall include the
18	posting of information on a website and shall provide appropriate
19	translations, as needed;
20	(4) Establish a policy statement on closing the achievement gap
21	for the local school administrative unit. This statement shall address why
22	closing the achievement gap is important to the entire community;
23	(5)(A) Set aside specific meetings to analyze and synthesize
24	data and information.
25	(B) The task force shall use the data to identify and
26	prioritize the problems with student achievement;
27	(6) Identify and review current effective programs and
28	instructional strategies that address student achievement needs, identify
29	criteria used to determine their effectiveness, determine changes to improve
30	the effectiveness, identify gaps in services, identify needed information to
31	determine research-based programs and strategies that are effective in
32	addressing the gaps; and
33	(7) Develop a report to the school and community that includes
34	an implementation plan, benchmarks, and the monitoring process.
35	(e)(1) Each task force may establish subcommittees to research answers
36	to the critical questions.

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1	(2) If subcommittees are established, they shall present their
2	findings to the full task force.
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4	SECTION 4. Teachers shall base their student promotion decisions on
5	multiple measures of student achievement and school success, including, but
6	not limited to, state-mandated assessments, factors such as classroom work,
7	grades, and quality of instruction received, and a student's best educational
8	interests.
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10	SECTION 5. Reporting Dropout Rates, Suspensions, Expulsions, and
11	Alternative Placements.
12	(a) The State Board of Education shall report annually to the Joint
13	Interim Oversight Committee on Education Reform and the Commission on Closing
14	the Academic Achievement Gap in Arkansas on the numbers of students who have
15	dropped out of school, been suspended, been expelled, or placed in an
16	alternative program.
17	(b) The data shall be reported in a disaggregated manner and be
18	readily available to the public.
19	(c) The state board shall not include students that have been expelled
20	from school when calculating the dropout rate.
21	(d) The board shall maintain a separate record of the number of
22	students who are expelled from school.
