## For An Act To Be Entitled

9 AN ACT TO REQUIRE ALL STATE AGENCIES USING THE  
10 ARKANSAS ADMINISTRATIVE STATEWIDE INFORMATION  
11 SYSTEM TO REPORT WITHIN TWENTY (20) DAYS TO THE  
12 HOUSE COMMITTEE ON ADVANCED COMMUNICATIONS AND  
13 INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AND THE SENATE COMMITTEE  
14 ON TECHNOLOGY AND LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS, CONCERNING  
15 COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH COMPLIANCE WITH THE SYSTEM;  
16 AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

## Subtitle

18 AN ACT TO REQUIRE ALL STATE AGENCIES  
19 USING THE ARKANSAS ADMINISTRATIVE  
20 STATEWIDE INFORMATION SYSTEM TO REPORT  
21 WITHIN TWENTY (20) DAYS TO THE HOUSE AND  
22 SENATE TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEES.

26 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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28 SECTION 1. (a) For purposes of this act, "state agency" means any  
29 board, commission, department, agency, institution, office, or officer, and  
30 any other office or unit of the State of Arkansas created or established  
31 under law or under any action of the Governor.

32 (b) Each state agency using the Arkansas Administrative Statewide  
33 Information System shall report within twenty (20) days after the effective  
34 date of this act to the House Committee on Advanced Communications and  
35 Information Technology and the Senate Committee on Technology and Legislative  
36 Affairs concerning any cost associated with the agency's compliance with the



1 system, including:

2 (i) Systems operations costs, including equipment costs;

3 (ii) Service costs;

4 (iii) Support costs;

5 (iv) Costs of training, including the grade levels of the  
6 employees who must receive training and the frequency with which training  
7 must be provided; and

8 (v) Any other costs associate with compliance with the  
9 administrative system.

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11 SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the  
12 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the General Assembly does not  
13 have current data regarding the costs to state agencies for complying with  
14 the Arkansas Administrative Statewide Information System; and that the  
15 General Assembly immediately needs this data to determine the affected state  
16 agencies' budgets for fiscal years 2003-2005. Therefore, an emergency is  
17 declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the  
18 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective  
19 on:

20 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

21 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,  
22 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the  
23 bill; or

24 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is  
25 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
