AN ACT TO REVISE THE DEFINITION OF PRIVATE CLUB
AS IT RELATES TO ON-PREMISES CONSUMPTION OF
ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

## Subtitle

AN ACT TO REVISE THE DEFINITION OF PRIVATE CLUB AS IT RELATES TO ONPREMISES CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES .

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 3-9-202(10)(A), concerning the definition of a private club as it relates to on-premises consumption of alcoholic beverages, is amended to read as follows:
(10)(A)(i) "Private club" means a nonprofit corporation organized and existing under the laws of this state no part of the net revenues of which shall inure directly or indirectly to the benefit of any of its members or any other individual except for the payment of bona fide expenses of the club's operations and which is conducted for some common recreational, social, patriotic, political, national, benevolent, athletic, or other nonprofit object or purpose other than the consumption of alcoholic beverages.
(ii) The nonprofit corporation shall have been in existence for a period of not less than one (l) year before application for a permit, as prescribed in this subchapter.
(iii) At the time of application for the permit, the nonprofit corporation must have not fewer than one hundred (100) members regularly paying annual dues of not less than five dollars ( $\$ 5.00$ ) per member and at the time of application must own or lease, be the holder of a buy-sell agreement or offer and acceptance, or have an option to lease a building, property, or space therein for the reasonable comfort and accommodation of its members and their families and guests and restrict the use of club facilities to such persons.
