19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

21 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 5-27-201 is amended to read as follows:

22 5-27-201. Endangering welfare of incompetent person - First degree.

23 (a) A person commits the offense of endangering the welfare of an
24 incompetent person in the first degree if, he or she purposely:

25 (1) Engages in conduct creating a substantial risk of death or
26 serious physical injury to an incompetent person ; or

27 (2) ~~being~~ Being a parent, guardian, person legally charged with
28 care or custody of an incompetent person, or a person charged with
29 supervision of an incompetent person, he or she purposely deserts the
30 incompetent person under circumstances creating a substantial risk of death
31 or serious physical injury.

32 (b)(1) Endangering the welfare of an incompetent person in the first
33 degree is a Class ~~D~~ C felony.

34 (2) Endangering the welfare of an incompetent person in the
35 first degree is a Class B felony if within the past five (5) years, the
36 person:

12 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 5-27-202 is amended to read as follows:

13 5-27-202. Endangering welfare of incompetent person - Second degree.

14 (a) A person commits the offense of endangering the welfare of an
15 incompetent person in the second degree if he knowingly engages in conduct
16 creating a substantial risk of serious harm to the physical or mental welfare
17 of one known by the actor to be an incompetent person.

18 (b)(1) Endangering the welfare of an incompetent person in the second
19 degree is a Class A misdemeanor or D felony.

20 (2) Endangering the welfare of an incompetent person in the
21 second degree is a Class C felony if within the past five (5) years, the
22 person:

23 (A) Plead guilty or nolo contendere to, or has been found
24 guilty of:

25 (i) Endangering the welfare of an incompetent person
26 in the first degree;

27 (ii) Endangering the welfare of an incompetent
28 person in the second degree;

29 (iii) Endangering the welfare of an incompetent
30 person in the third degree; or

31 (B) Violated an equivalent penal law of another state or
32 foreign jurisdiction.

34 SECTION 3. Endangering welfare of incompetent person - Third degree.

35 (a) A person commits the offense of endangering the welfare of an
36 incompetent person in the third degree if he or she recklessly engages in

1 conduct creating a substantial risk of serious harm to the physical or mental
2 welfare of one known by the actor to be an incompetent person.

3 (b)(1) Endangering the welfare of an incompetent person in the third
4 degree is a Class A misdemeanor.

5 (2) Endangering the welfare of an incompetent person in the
6 third degree is a Class D felony if within the past five (5) years, the
7 person:

8 (A) Plead guilty or nolo contendere to, or has been found
9 guilty of:

10 (i) Endangering the welfare of an incompetent person
11 in the first degree;

12 (ii) Endangering the welfare of an incompetent
13 person in the second degree;

14 (iii) Endangering the welfare of an incompetent
15 person in the third degree; or

16 (B) Violated an equivalent penal law of another state or
17 foreign jurisdiction.
