21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

23 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 7-1-104(a) is amended to read as follows:

24 (a) The following offenses shall be deemed felonies punishable as
25 provided in this section:

26 (1) No person shall falsely make or fraudulently destroy any
27 certificate of nominations or any part thereof, file any certificate of
28 nominations knowing the certificate or any part thereof to be false, ~~supress~~
29 suppress any nomination which has been filed or any part thereof, or forge or
30 falsely write the name or initials of any election official on any ballot;

31 (2) No public official or other person shall in any manner
32 willfully or corruptly permit any person not entitled to register for the
33 purpose of voting to register, nor shall a public official or other person
34 forge or attempt to forge a registration;

35 (3) No person shall vote in any election in the state unless the
36 person is a qualified elector of this state and has registered to vote in the



1 manner provided by law;

2 (4) It shall be unlawful for any person to offer, accept,
3 receive, or pay any person any money, goods, wares, or merchandise or solicit
4 any money, goods, wares, or merchandise for the purpose of influencing his or
5 her vote during the progress of any election in this state;

6 (5) It shall be unlawful for any person to make any threat or
7 attempt to intimidate any elector or the family, business, or profession of
8 the elector, and it shall be unlawful to attempt to prevent any qualified
9 elector from voting at any election;

10 (6) It shall be unlawful for any person to prevent or to
11 interfere with any qualified elector from voting at any polling site, or to
12 attempt to prevent or interfere with any qualified elector from voting at any
13 polling site;

14 ~~(6)~~(7) It shall be unlawful for any person to attend any polling
15 site on election day and hand out or give away any campaign cards, placards,
16 or other articles for the purpose of influencing the electors to vote for any
17 candidate, except in the manner now provided by law;

18 ~~(7)~~(8) No person shall tamper with a voting machine or
19 fraudulently affect or attempt to affect its results;

20 ~~(8)~~(9) No person may cast a ballot in more than one (1) party
21 primary election on the same day in this state or for candidates for more
22 than one (1) political party;

23 ~~(9)~~(10) No person shall vote in any election more than one (1)
24 vote;

25 ~~(10)~~(11) No person shall vote or attempt to vote other than his
26 or her legal ballot;

27 ~~(11)~~(12) No election official shall knowingly permit any person
28 to vote other than his or her legal ballot in any election;

29 ~~(12)~~(13) No election official or other person shall fraudulently
30 permit any person to vote illegally, refuse the vote of any qualified
31 elector, or cast up or make a false return of any election;

32 ~~(13)~~(14) No election official or other person shall willfully
33 make a false count of any election ballots or falsely or fraudulently certify
34 the returns of any election;

35 ~~(14)~~(15) No person shall fraudulently change, alter, or
36 obliterate the poll books or books of any election or break any seals upon

1 any ballot box, voting machine, or stub box, except as authorized by law;
2 ~~(15)~~(16) No person shall contrive, alter, forge, counterfeit,
3 detain, mutilate, steal, secrete, or destroy any election returns or election
4 materials for the purpose of hindering or preventing or falsely reporting a
5 tabulation or check of the returns; and
6 ~~(16)~~(17) Any person who violates the provisions of § 7-5-702 or
7 who shall disclose how any voter may have voted unless compelled to do so in
8 a judicial proceeding shall be deemed guilty of a Class D felony and punished
9 as provided in this section.
