6	6-13-1602. Certified schools.	
7	(a) Before January 1, 2004, the State Board of Education shall review	
8	all public and private schools in the state and determine if the schools meet	
9	all state standards necessary to provide students with an equal opportunity	
10	for an adequate education.	
11	(b) The State Board of Education shall designate schools that meet all	
12	state standards necessary to provide students with an equal opportunity or an	
13	adequate education as "certified schools".	
14	(c) The State Board of Education shall maintain a list of all	
15	certified schools in the state and provide a copy of the list to parents upon	
16	request.	
17	(d)(1) The State Board of Education and the Department of Education	
18	shall ensure and shall have the authority to undertake all measures necessary	
19	to ensure that there is a public certified school available for every child	
20	ages five (5) to eighteen (18) years in the state and shall require that the	
21	public certified school that is available to the child provide transportation	
22	for any child choosing the attend the public certified school.	
23	(2) Any child ages five (5) to eighteen (18) years that does not	
24	receive an education certificate for school attendance may attend the nearest	
25	available public certified public school.	
26		
27	6-13-1603. Education certificate program.	
28	Parents or guardians of any child ages five (5) to eighteen (18) years	
29	shall receive from the Department of Education an education certificate for	
30	their child to enroll in any certified school in the state if they request an	
31	education certificate no later than July 1 for the school in which the	
32	student intends to use the education certificate.	
33		
34	6-13-1604. Students in juvenile detention facilities.	
35	The provisions of this subchapter do not apply to a student who is	
36	enrolled in a school operating for the purpose of providing educational	

1	services to youth in a juvenile detention facility as defined by § 6-20-104.
2	
3	6-13-1605. Renewal.
4	(a) For purposes of continuity of educational choice, the education
5	certificate shall be renewed until the student graduates from high school or
6	no longer attends school in grades kindergarten through twelve (K-12).
7	(b) All certified schools accepting education certificates from the
8	state shall provide locations and times to take all statewide assessments
9	required by state law.
10	(c) Students with disabilities who are eligible to receive services
11	from the school district in the student's assigned school district under
12	federal or state law, and who participate in the education certificate
13	program, shall remain eligible to receive services from schools that were
14	provided by the student's assigned school district by the certified school $\underline{as}$
15	provided by federal or state law.
16	
17	6-13-1606. Private school eligibility.
18	(a) To be eligible to participate in the education certificate
19	program, a private school may be sectarian or nonsectarian, and shall:
20	(1) Be located in Arkansas;
21	(2)(A) Demonstrate fiscal soundness by being in operation for at
22	<u>least one (1) school year or provide the Department of Education with a</u>
23	statement by a certified public accountant confirming that the private school
24	desiring to participate has sufficient capital or credit to operate the
25	school for the upcoming year and serve the number of students anticipated
26	with expected revenues from tuition and other sources that may be reasonably
27	expected.
28	(B) In lieu of a statement, a surety bond or letter of
29	credit for the amount equal to the education certificate funds for any
30	quarter may be filed with the Department of Education;
31	(3) Except for the first year of implementation, notify the
32	Department of Education of its intent to participate in the program under
33	this subchapter no later than May 1 of the school year preceding the school
34	year in which it intends to participate. The notice shall specify the grade
35	levels and services that the private school has available for the education
36	certificate program:

1	(4) Comply with the antidiscrimination provisions of 42 USC
2	2000d as it existed on January 1, 2003;
3	(5) Meet state and local health and safety laws and codes;
4	(6)(A) Accept education certificate students on an entirely
5	random and religious-neutral basis without regard to the student's past
6	academic history.
7	(B) The school may give preference in accepting
8	applications to siblings of students who have already been accepted on $\underline{a}$
9	random and religious-neutral basis;
10	(7) Be designated as a certified school by the Department of
11	Education;
12	(8) Employ or contract with teachers who hold a baccalaureate or
13	higher degree, or have at least three (3) years of teaching experience in
14	public or private schools, or have special skills, knowledge, or expertise
15	that qualifies them to provide instruction in subjects taught;
16	(9) Comply with all state laws relating to private schools;
17	(10) Accept as full tuition and fees the amount provided by the
18	state for each student;
19	(11) Agree not to compel any student attending the private
20	school on an education certificate to profess a specific ideological belief,
21	to pray, or to worship; and
22	(12) Adhere to the tenets of its published disciplinary
23	procedures before the expulsion of any education certificate student.
24	(b) A private school that fails to comply with this section shall
25	forfeit its designation as a certified school.
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27	6-13-1607. Obligation of program participation.
28	(a) Any student participating in the education certificate program
29	shall remain in attendance throughout the school year, unless excused by the
30	school for illness or other good cause, and shall comply fully with the
31	school's code of conduct.
32	(b) The parent or guardian of each student participating in the
33	education certificate program shall comply fully with the school's parental
34	involvement requirements, unless excused by the school for illness or other
35	good cause.
36	(c) The parent or guardian shall ensure that the student participating

3	(d) A parent or student who fails to comply with this section shall
4	forfeit the student's eligibility to participate in the education certificate
5	program.

7	6-13-1608. Education certificate funding and payment.
8	(a)(1) The education certificate granted for an eligible student shall
9	be four thousand dollars (\$4,000).
10	(2)(A) Following annual notification on July 1 of the number of
11	participants, the Department of Education shall set aside the calculated
12	amount of moneys from each public school district's State Equalization
13	Funding allocation and transfer that amount of appropriation to the special
14	line item established by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State for the
15	education certificate program.
16	(B) The calculated amount of education certificate awarded
17	to each eligible student in the district shall be made available for
18	${\color{blue} \textbf{quarterly disbursement to the parents or guardians of participating students.}}$
19	(C)(i) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State may establish
20	a special line item appropriation by a transfer from the appropriation
21	provided for State Equalization Funding from which to pay the participants of
22	the education certificate program authorized in this subchapter.
23	(ii) The amount of the special line item
24	appropriation shall be that amount certified by the Department of Education
25	to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State.
26	(iii) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall
27	notify the Auditor of State of the transfers.
28	(b)(1) The Department of Education shall make education certificate
29	program payments in four equal amounts no later than September 1, November 1,
30	February 1, and April 1 of each year in which the education certificate
31	program is in force.
32	(2) The initial payment shall be made after the Department of
33	Education's verification of admission acceptance and compliance with all
34	requirements of this subchapter.
35	(3) Subsequent payments shall be made upon verification of
36	continued enrollment, attendance at the private school, and compliance with

1	all requirements of this subchapter.	
2	(4) Payment shall be by individual warrant, made payable to the	
3	student's parent or guardian, and mailed by the Department of Education to	
4	the private school of the parent's or guardian's choice.	
5	(5) The parent or guardian shall restrictively endorse the	
6	warrant to the private school.	
7	(6)(A) If a student transfers during the school year to another	
8	certified school, the student's education certificate, less a pro rata	
9	portion for the days the student was enrolled in the transferring school,	
10	shall be refunded to the Department of Education by the public or private	
11	school and the Department of Education shall issue a voucher in an amount	
12	equal to the remaining balance to the certified school to which the student	
13	transferred.	
14	(B) If a student quits attending a certified school during	
15	the school year, the student's education certificate, less a pro rata portion	
16	for the days the student was enrolled in the school, shall be refunded to the	
17	Department of Education by the public or private school.	
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19	6-13-1609. Liability.	
20	No liability shall arise on the part of the state based on any grant or	
21	use of a education certificate.	
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23	6-13-1610. Rules.	
24	(a) The State Board of Education may adopt rules and regulations	
25	necessary to implement this subchapter.	
26	(b) However, the inclusion of eligible private schools within options	
27	available to Arkansas public school students does not expand the regulatory	
28	authority of the state, its officers, or any school district to impose any	
29	additional regulation of private schools beyond those reasonably necessary to	
30	enforce this subchapter.	
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
