16	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
17	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Department of Health , in		
18	response to the federal Homeland Security Act of 2002, will begin voluntary		
19	smallpox vaccinations of health care workers and public safety personnel on		
20	February 19, 2003, and participation in the voluntary program will be		
21	enhanced by clarification that an adverse reaction to vaccine will be		
22	compensable under the Workers' Compensation Law. Therefore, an emergency is		
23	declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the		
24	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective		
25	on:		
26	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
27	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
28	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
29	bill; or		
30	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
31	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.		
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
