## For An Act To Be Entitled

AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE DEFENSE TO PROSECUTION FOR THE VIOLATION OF OPERATING AN ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLE ON A PUBLIC STREET OR HIGHWAY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES .

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 27-21-109(b), concerning the defenses to prosecution for violations of the all-terrain vehicle law, is amended to read as follows:
(b) It shall be a complete defense to prosecution under this chapter § 27-21-106 for a violation of operating an all-terrain vehicle upon the public streets or highways if the all-terrain vehicle operator can show by a preponderance of the evidence that:
(1) The public street or highway was outside the city limits of any municipality or incorporated town in Arkansas; and
(2) The public street or highway was not a United States interstate highway; and
(3) Traveling on the public street or highway was the most reasonable route of access available to him or her from one (l) offroad trail to another offroad trail or from his or her private property to an offroad
trail; and
(4) His or her purpose for riding on the public street or highway was to get from one (l) offroad trail to another offroad trail or his or her purpose for riding on the public street or highway was to get from his or her private property to an offroad trail.
