21	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 5-62-120 is amended to read as follows:		
22	5-62-120. Unlawful dog animal fighting.		
23 24	(a)(1) A person commits the offense of unlawful dog animal fighting in the first degree if he or she knowingly:

3	(2) Unlawful <del>dog</del> <u>animal</u> fighting in the first degree is a Class
4	D felony.
5	(b)(1) A person commits the offense of unlawful $\frac{dog}{dog}$ animal fighting in
6	the second degree if he or she knowingly:
7	(A) Purchases a ticket of admission to or is present at $\frac{a}{a}$
8	dog an animal fight; or
9	(B) Witnesses a dog an animal fight if it is presented as
10	a public spectacle.
11	(2) Unlawful $\frac{dog}{dog}$ animal fighting in the second degree is a Class
12	A misdemeanor.
13	(c) Upon the arrest of any person for violating the provisions of this
14	section, the arresting law enforcement officer or animal control officer
15	shall have the authority to seize and take custody of all $\frac{\text{dogs}}{\text{dogs}}$ in the
16	possession of the arrested person.
17	(d) $\underline{(1)}$ Upon the conviction of any person for violating the provisions
18	of this section, any court of competent jurisdiction shall have the authority
19	to order the forfeiture by the convicted person of all <del>dogs</del> <u>animals</u> the use
20	of which was the basis of the conviction.
21	(2) Any dogs animals ordered forfeited under the provisions of
22	this subsection shall be placed in the custody of a society which is
23	incorporated for the prevention of cruelty to animals, or an animal control
24	agency.
25	(e) In addition to the fines, penalties, and forfeitures imposed under
26	the provisions of this section, the court may require the defendant to make
27	restitution to the state, any of its political subdivisions, or a society
28	which is incorporated for the prevention of cruelty to animals for housing,
29	feeding, or providing medical treatment to dogs animals used for unlawful dog
30	animal fighting.
31	(f) For purposes of this section:
32	(1) "Animal" means any animal that is in the custody of humans,
33	including, but not limited to, any dog or bird; and
34	(2) "Animal fighting" means combat between two (2) or more
35	animals.
