17	(2) Be governed by a Board of Directors;
18	(3) Develop and implement written personnel policies that state
19	the shelter's employment practices;
20	(4) Develop and implement written procedures that conform with
21	the uniform system of recordkeeping developed by the Arkansas Child
22	Abuse/Rape/Domestic Violence Commission or its designee to ensure proper
23	handling of funds; and
24	(5) Provide the commission or its designee with statistical data

26	(A) The type of services provided by the shelter; and
27	(B) The number of victims and children served each year.

29	9-4-108. Training requirements.
30	Every shelter shall:

32	orientation approved by the Arkansas Child Abuse/Rape/Domestic Violence
33	Commission or its designee within six (6) months after joining the board.
34	(B) The orientation shall include an explanation of the dynamics
35	of domestic violence and the role of a board member;

1	to attend fifteen (15) hours of initial staff training approved by the
2	commission or its designee.

35	9-4-109. Right of entry.
36	The Arkansas Child Abuse/Rape/Domestic Violence Commission or its

1	designee may enter and inspect the premises of a shelter to perform an annual
2	evaluation or to otherwise determine compliance with this subchapter.
3	
4	<u>9-4-110. Reports.</u>
5	By October 1 of each year, the Arkansas Child Abuse/Rape/Domestic
6	Violence Commission or its designee shall provide an annual report to the
7	chairpersons of the Senate Interim Committee on Children and Youth and the
8	House Interim Committee on Aging, Children and Youth, Legislative and
9	Military Affairs containing the following information:
10	(1) The incidence of domestic violence in this state based on
11	information obtained from shelters under this subchapter;
12	(2) A description of shelters that meet the requirements of and
13	receive funding from the commission or its designee under this subchapter;
14	and
15	(3) The number of persons assisted by the shelters that receive

18	9-4-111. Disclosure of information.
19	Information received by the Arkansas Child Abuse/Rape/Domestic Violence

21	evaluations, inspections, or otherwise shall be confidential information and
22	shall not be disclosed publicly in a manner as to identify individuals or
23	facilities.
24	
25	<u>9-4-112. Immunity from civil liability.</u>
26	The Arkansas Child Abuse/Rape/Domestic Violence Commission, its
27	employees, and its designees shall be immune from civil liability for
28	performing the duties under this subchapter.
29	
30	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 19, Chapter 6, Subchapter 4 is amended
31	to add an additional section to read as follows:
32	19-6-487. Domestic Peace Fund.
33	(a) There is created on the books of the Treasurer of State, Auditor
34 25	of State, and Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a special revenue fund to be
35	known as the "Domestic Peace Fund".
36	(b)(1)(A) All moneys collected for the additional marriage license fee

1	levied to fund the Domestic Peace Fund and to be used by the Arkansas Child
2	Abuse/Rape/Domestic Violence Commission as provided under the Domestic Peace
3	Act shall be deposited into the State Treasury to the credit of the fund as
4	special revenue; and
5	(B) The moneys designated under § 26-52-107(b)(1)(C) shall
6	be deposited into the fund as special revenue.
7	(2) The fund shall also consist of any other revenues as may be
8	authorized by law.
9	(c) The fund shall be used exclusively by the Arkansas Child
10	Abuse/Rape/Domestic Violence Commission as provided under The Domestic Peace
11	Act, § 9-4-101 et seq.
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
