13 TO REVISE ARKANSAS LAW REGARDING THE
14 PENALTIES FOR POSSESSION OF ILLEGAL

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19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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21 SECTION 1. The purpose of this act is to revise Arkansas law regarding
22 the penalties for possession of illegal drugs.
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24 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 5-64-1101(a)(4), regarding the penalties
25 for possession of illegal drugs, is amended to read as follows:

26 (4)(A) Any manufacturer, wholesaler, or distributor licensed by the
27 State Board of Pharmacy who meets one of the requirements in (a)(4)(B) of
28 this section and sells, transfers, or otherwise furnishes ephedrine,
29 pseudoephedrine, or phenylpropanolamine or their salts, optical isomers, and
30 salts of optical isomers to a licensed pharmacy, physician, dentist,
31 podiatrist, veterinarian, or any person who possesses a sales and use tax
32 permit issued by the department.

33 (B)(i) The manufacturer, wholesaler, or distributor must hold or
34 store the substances in facilities that meet the packaging requirements of §
35 5-64-1005(d)(1), (2), and (3).

36 (ii) The manufacturer, wholesaler, or distributor must



1 sell, transfer, or otherwise furnish only to healthcare professionals
2 identified in subsections (a)(1) and (a)(3) of this section.

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
