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7	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the	
8	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that revenue available for the	
9	support of necessary state services has declined during the last twelve (12)	
10	months as a result of the nationwide economic slow down; that without	
11	additional revenue, some state services will be reduced or eliminated; that	
12	some Arkansans will suffer as a result of service reductions or cuts; and	
13	that this act is immediately necessary because it will provide the necessary	
14	revenue to avoid state service reductions or cuts. Therefore, an emergency	
15	is declared to exist and this act being necessary for the preservation of the	
16	public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on July 1, 2003.	
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
