  - (e) No used motor vehicle dealer or new motor vehicle dealer, as defined in the Arkansas Code shall sell any motor vehicle that fails to conform to the requirements of this section or of any regulation adopted under this section.
    - (f) Any installer of motor vehicle glass tinting material who installs any glass tinting in violation of this section or otherwise violates this section or any person operating any motor vehicle with glass tinting or other after market alteration of the glass in the vehicle which does not meet the requirements of this section shall be guilty of a Class B misdemeanor.
- 12 (g)(1) The Director of the Arkansas State Police shall promulgate
  13 regulations governing the use of mirrored glass and window tinting, and the
  14 use of reflectorized or mirrored materials in or on motor vehicle
  15 windshields, side windows, sidewings, and rear windows that prevent a person
  16 with normal vision from looking into the motor vehicle from seeing or
  17 identifying persons or objects inside the motor vehicle.
  - (2) The regulations adopted under this section may apply to:

    (A) Persons who own a motor vehicle that does not conform to the requirements of this section or of any regulation adopted under this section; and
  - (B) Persons who have establish residency in this state and are required to register a motor vehicle that they had previously registered in another state that does not conform to the requirements of this section or of any regulation adopted under this section.
  - (h) The Director of the Arkansas State Police may collect a fee not to exceed ten dollars (\$10.00) for each motor vehicle that is inspected by and registered with the Arkansas State Police as a vehicle with proper mirrored or reflective window tinting as allowed by regulations adopted under this section.

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that certain members of the criminal community are using mirrored window tinting to hide criminal activity; that mirrored window tinting as used by members of the criminal community and the public also creates a danger to the safety of law

1	enforcement officers who are unable to see inside a motor vehicle before		
2	placing themselves in a position of harm. Therefore, an emergency is		
3	declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the		
4	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective		
5	on:		
6		(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;	
7		(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,	
8	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
9	bill; or		
10		(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is	
11	overridden,	the date the last house overrides the veto.
