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20	SECTION 1. (a)	There is created a committee to	be known as the
21	"Advisory Committee on	Educational Access to Technology	, II <u>.</u>
22	(b)(1) The comm	ittee shall consist of five (5) m	members as follows:
23	<u>(i)</u>	Two (2) members appointed by a m	ajority vote of the
24	Senate Technology and	Legislative Affairs Committee;	
25	<u>(ii)</u>	Two (2) members appointed by a	majority vote of the
26	House Committee on Adv	anced Communication and Informati	on Technology; and
27	<u>(iii</u>) One (1) member appointed by a	majority vote of the
28	Joint Committee on Adv	anced Communication and Informati	on Technology.
29	<u>(2)</u> The a	ppointees shall be members of Ark	ansas' business

2	(2) Three (3) members of the committee shall constitute a quoru		
3	for the purpose of transacting business.		
4	(3) A quorum is required for any action of the committee.		
5	(f)(1) The committee shall review the technology needs of the Arkansas		
6	public schools serving the needs of students in grades kindergarten through		
7	twelve (K-12) and recommend a method to ensure that all school districts and		
8	students have substantially equal access to technology.		
9	(2) The committee shall work with members of the education		
10	community, the business community, and the Department of Education to		
11	determine methods for effectively teaching students to use technology and the		
12	most effective manner in which to incorporate technology into instruction for		
13	students.		
14	(g) The committee shall report its findings and recommendations to the		
15	chairs of the Joint Committee on Advanced Communication and Information		
16	Technology, the House Committee on Education, and the Senate Committee on		
17	Education no later than September 1, 2003, and every six (6) months		
18	thereafter.		
19	(h) The Bureau of Legislative Research employees providing staff		
20	assistance to the Joint Committee on Advanced Communication and Information		
21	Technology shall also furnish reasonable staff assistance to the Advisory		
22	Committee on Educational Access to Technology.		
23	(i)(1) The members of the Advisory Committee on Educational Access to		
24	Technology shall serve without pay.		
25	(2) All members of the commission may receive expense		
26	reimbursement in accordance with Arkansas Code § 25-16-902, to be paid by the		
27	Bureau of Legislative Research.		
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29	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
30	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Arkansas Supreme Court has		
31	ruled that the current system of education in Arkansas is inadequate and		
32	inequitable, and has instructed the General Assembly to define what is		
33	necessary to provide an adequate and equitable education for the children of		
34	Arkansas, and has assigned to the General Assembly the responsibility to		
35	assess, evaluate, and monitor public education across the state to ensure		
36	that an equal educational opportunity for an adequate education is being		

Т	substantially alforded to Arkansas' school children. A committee must be		
2	formed to determine if substantially equal access to technology is being		
3	afforded Arkansas' school children and a delay in the formation will prevent		
4	the committee from having adequate measures in place for the relief from the		
5	court's stay on January 1, 2004. Therefore, an emergency is declared to		
6	exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the		
7	public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:		
8	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
9	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
10	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
11	bill; or		
12	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
13	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.		
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
