6	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
7	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the state is experiencing		
8	budgetary hardships due to a decline in the economic conditions in the state;		
9	that additional revenue is needed for Medicaid services in this state, that		
10	federal Medicaid matching money may be lost if additional revenue is not		
11	generated; and that this act is immediately necessary to ensure that
