20	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 20, Chapter 10, is amended to add	an

23	(a) The General Assembly finds:	
24	(1) To the extent minority owned businesses are given fair	
25	opportunities to compete, all Arkansans benefit;	
26	(2) During 2002, the State of Arkansas spent nine hundred	
27	million four hundred thousand dollars (\$900,400,000) procuring goods and	
28	services;	
29	(3) Although the state possesses over seven thousand (7,000	<u>)</u>
30	minority owned businesses, less than three tenths of one percent (.03%)	<u>of</u>
31	state expenditures on goods and services was spent with minority owned	
32	businesses in 2002;	
33	(4) Small and minority owned businesses employ forty-eight	<u>and</u>
34	nine tenths percent (48.9%) of the state's total employment;	
35	(5) Seventy-two percent (72%) of all current jobs in the De	
36	Region of Arkansas, Louisiana, and Mississippi are provided through smal	1 and

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1	minority owned businesses;
