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33	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the

36	lost by the various mergers and acquisitions; that vital sources of training

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1	for industry is being affected during 2003; and that this act is immediately		
2	necessary because the states training of its workforce is vital to the		
3	stability of the state. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this		
4	act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace,		
5	health, and safety shall become effective on:		
6	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
7	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
8	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
9	bill; or		
10	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
11	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
