21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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23 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 5-55-103 is amended to read as follows:
24 5-55-103. Unlawful acts - Classification.

25 (a)(1) It shall be unlawful for any person to commit ~~medicaid~~ Medicaid
26 fraud as defined in this chapter, and any person found to have committed any
27 such act or acts shall be deemed guilty of ~~medicaid~~ Medicaid fraud.

28 ~~(b)-(1)-(2)~~ Medicaid fraud shall be:

29 (A) A Class B felony if the aggregate amount of payments
30 illegally claimed is two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) or more;

31 (B) A Class C felony if the aggregate amount of payments
32 illegally claimed is less than two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) but
33 more than two hundred dollars (\$200).

34 ~~(2)-(3)~~ Otherwise, ~~medicaid~~ Medicaid fraud shall be a Class A
35 misdemeanor.

36 (b)(1) A person commits illegal Medicaid participation if:



1 (A) Having been found guilty of or having pled guilty or
2 nolo contendere to the charge of Medicaid fraud, theft of public benefits, or
3 abuse of adults as defined in the Criminal Code, that person participates,
4 directly or indirectly, in the Arkansas Medicaid program; or

5 (B) Being a provider, certified under Title XIX of the
6 Social Security Act participating in the Arkansas Medicaid program, or its
7 fiscal agent, the person knowingly employs, hires as an independent
8 contractor or as a consultant, or otherwise involves any person who has been
9 found guilty of or who has pled guilty or nolo contendere to the charge of
10 Medicaid fraud, theft of public benefits, or abuse of adults, as defined in
11 the Criminal Code, in the operations of the provider.

12 (2) Illegal Medicaid participation shall be:

13 (A) A Class A misdemeanor for the first offense;

14 (B) A Class D felony for the second offense; and

15 (C) A Class C felony for the third and subsequent
16 offenses.

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18 SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
19 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Medicaid Fraud Act is in
20 immediate need of the revision to clarify an ambiguity in the law; and that
21 the provisions of this act are essential to successful operations and
22 activities of the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit and the Department of Human
23 Services. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being
24 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and
25 safety shall become effective on:

26 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

27 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
28 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
29 bill; or

30 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
31 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
