7	(a)(1) There is established the Health Adequacy Committee consisting
8	of twenty-one (21) members.
9	(2) The following members shall be appointed by the Joint
10	Committee on Educational Adequacy by a majority of a quorum:
11	(A) One (1) member who is a pediatrician;
12	(B) One (1) member who is a school nurse who is currently
13	working in a public elementary school in this state;

2	(a) The Health Adequacy Committee shall:
3	(1) Study the health care needs of the school age children of
4	Arkansas to obtain an adequate education;
5	(2) Study and evaluate health programs in the schools and their
6	effectiveness in allowing students to obtain an adequate education including,
7	but not limited to, school nurse programs;
8	(3) Study and evaluate whether children are receiving adequate
9	health care and correction of health problems while in school;
10	(4) Study the effects of inadequate health on the performance of
11	children in the classroom in obtaining an adequate education, equal
12	educational opportunity, or both;
13	(5) Develop a strategic statewide plan to ensure adequate health
14	care of school age children while in the classroom to obtain an adequate
15	education; and
16	(6) Develop a strategic statewide plan so school age children
17	can become more responsible in making preventative decisions regarding their
18	health and thus increase educational opportunity.
19	(b) By September 1, 2003, the committee shall report its findings and

12	of State, and Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a special revenue fund to be

21	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the

24	health care adequacy among school age children in Arkansas is an essential
25	component of any definition of educational adequacy; that the initial reports
26	of the Health Adequacy Committee created by this act must be available to the
27	Joint Committee on Educational Adequacy before the formulation of the final
28	report. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being
29	immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and
30	safety shall become effective on:
31	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
32	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
33	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
34	bill; or
35	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
36	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
