## HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO SECTION 14 OF ARTICLE 19 OF THE ARKANSAS CONSTITUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO ESTABLISH A STATE LOTTERY TO HELP FUND PUBLIC EDUCATION IN THIS STATE.

## Subtitle

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BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS AND BY THE SENATE, A MAJORITY OF ALL MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE AGREEING THERETO:

That the following is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Arkansas, and upon being submitted to the electors of the state for approval or rejection at the next general election for Representatives and Senators, if a majority of the electors voting thereon at the election, adopt the amendment, the amendment shall become a part of the Constitution of the State of Arkansas, to wit:

SECTION 1. Section 14 of Article 19 of the Arkansas Constitution is amended to read as follows:
§ 14. Lotteries prohibited.
No lottery shall be authorized by this State, nor shall the sale of
tottery tickets be allowed.
(a) Except as specifically provided in this section, all lotteries and the sale of lottery tickets are prohibited.
(b) (l) The General Assembly may by law define lottery and provide for the operation and regulation of a lottery or lotteries by or on behalf of the state, and for any matters relating to the purposes or provisions of this subsection.
(2) Proceeds derived from the lottery or lotteries operated by or on behalf of the state shall be deposited into the State Treasury and used to pay the operating expenses of the lottery or lotteries, including all prizes, without any appropriation required by law, and to supplement, not supplant, appropriations provided by the General Assembly for educational programs and educational purposes, and for a trust fund as provided by this amendment and the General Assembly.
(3) The proceeds after payment of the operating expenses shall
be separately accounted for and divided as follows:
(A) (i) Fifty percent (50\%) shall be deposited into and held in a trust fund entitled "Education Trust Fund" together with any interest accumulated on the funds until the Education Trust Fund has a balance equal to or exceeding one hundred million dollars (\$100,000,000); (ii) Any amount in Education Trust Fund balance exceeding one hundred million dollars $(\$ 100,000,000)$ may be subject to appropriation by the General Assembly solely for educational programs and educational purposes; and
(B) Fifty percent (50\%) shall be specifically identified as a separate budget category entitled "Lottery Proceeds", and subject to appropriation by the General Assembly solely for educational programs and educational purposes.

SECTION 2. This amendment becomes effective on January 1, 2005. /s/ King
