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20 SECTION 1.

21 (a) The General Assembly may levy a state property tax for public
22 education purposes.

23 (b) The state property tax levy may be a substitute for any or all
24 local public education millage rates, including those used for maintenance
25 and operation and debt service.

26 (c)(1) The state public education property tax shall be subject to
27 revenue limitations.

28 (2) If, as a result of a countywide reappraisal or reassessment
29 of property subject to ad valorem taxes, the total assessed value of real and
30 personal property in the taxing unit increases by five percent (5%) or more,
31 excluding increases resulting from newly discovered real property or new
32 construction and improvements to real property, the millage rate shall be
33 reduced to limit revenue increases to no more than five percent (5%) above
34 the previous year, except for those increases resulting from newly discovered
35 or new construction and improvements to real property.
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SECTION 2. This amendment shall become effective January 1, 2005.

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
