14	CIVILIAN CONSERVATION CORPS.

17	WHEREAS, the Civilian Conservation Corps was created on March 31, 1933,
18	by the administration of Franklin Delano Roosevelt as part of the Emergency
19	Relief Act; and
20	
21	WHEREAS, the Civilian Conservation Corps provided useful conservation
22	work for over three million unemployed young men during the century's worst
23	national economic depression and provided them with opportunities to learn
24	life-time skills which became careers; and
25	
26	WHEREAS, the efforts of these young men resulted in the planting of
27	millions of trees, the construction of lookout towers, the construction of
28	thousands of miles of telephone lines, roads and trails, the fighting of
29	forest fires, and the creation of new parks and upgrading of existing parks
30	and campgrounds; and

32	WHEREAS, examples in the State of Arkansas of the fine work and
33	architecturally and historically significant structures include, but are not
34	limited to: The Mirror Lake and Sugarloaf Fire Tower Historic Districts in
35	Stone County, historic structures in Boyle Park in Little Rock, Mather Lodge,
36	trails and other structures in Petit Jean State Park, the bridge and cabins



at Devil's Den State Park, the Forest Service Headquarters Historic District in Hot Springs, and structures in Crowley's Ridge State Park; and WHEREAS, the accomplishments of this work benefited the State of Arkansas and brought satisfaction and pride to members of the Civilian Conservation Corps who participated in these programs, and their efforts gained the respect of grateful Arkansans and Americans; and NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: That the House of Representatives hereby expresses its appreciation to the members of the Civilian Conservation Corps, and commend them for their accomplishments which still benefit the citizens of this state. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the House of Representatives encourages all Arkansans to celebrate March 31, 2003, as the Civilian Conservation Corps Day, the seventieth anniversary of the Civilian Conservation Corps.
