WHEREAS, the state of Arkansas currently has no liver transplant program available to its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Arkansas must travel outside the state and incur the expense of travel, meals, and lodging for extended periods of time if they require a liver transplant; and

WHEREAS, a liver transplant program at the state's teaching hospital can provide state-of-the-art health care for all citizens of the state; and

WHEREAS, the establishment of such a program provides opportunities for training of future specialists, most of whom will stay in the state to practice; and

WHEREAS, our citizens covered by Medicare currently must travel to another state for a liver transplant and Arkansas Medicare dollars are expended in that state to cover the cost of the transplant,

NOW THEREFORE,
BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS,

That the House of Representatives encourages the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences to establish and develop a nationally recognized program for liver transplants.
