10 BETWEEN FEDERAL GOVERNMENT RETIREMENT SYSTEMS AND
11 CERTAIN STATE GOVERNMENT RETIREMENT SYSTEMS TO
12 ENCOURAGE THE PORTABILITY OF RETIREMENT CREDIT
13 FOR GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

15 TO PROVIDE RECOGNITION OF SERVICE CREDIT
16 BETWEEN FEDERAL GOVERNMENT RETIREMENT
17 SYSTEMS AND CERTAIN STATE GOVERNMENT
18 RETIREMENT SYSTEMS TO ENCOURAGE THE
19 PORTABILITY OF RETIREMENT CREDIT FOR
20 GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES.
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24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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26 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 24, Chapter 1, Subchapter 1 is amended
27 to add an additional section to read as follows:

28 24-1-107. Recognition of federal retirement programs.

29 (a)(1) The Board of Trustees of the Arkansas Public Employees'
30 Retirement System and the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System shall develop
31 policies and regulations to recognize the service credit for members of each
32 system earned in the retirement systems of federal government agencies.

33 (2) The former federal employee who becomes a member shall
34 receive service credit in the system for the member's service with the
35 federal retirement system under the regulations.

36 (b)(1) The active member of the state system shall receive credit for



1 the member's federal service upon the payment of the employee and employer
2 contributions prescribed by the board's regulations, together with regular
3 interest from the dates for the federal service to the date of payment.

4 (2) The provisions for determining a year of federal service
5 credit shall be under the regulations of each system.

6 (3) The person may qualify for age and service retirement in the
7 state system using the federal credited service plus the member's credited
8 service acquired in the employ of the state employers to meet the minimum
9 service requirements of the state systems.

10 (c) The boards of trustees of the state systems shall promulgate rules
11 and regulations to permit the purchase of credited service for time an active
12 member of the system had been a member of a federal retirement system.

13 (d) The member shall certify in a manner prescribed by the boards of
14 trustees that he or she is not eligible to receive a retirement benefit from
15 the federal retirement system in which he or she had previously been a
16 member.
