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13	SECTION 16. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
14	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that practitioners who have been		
15	serving patients for many years may be forced to close their practices and		
16	many citizens of Arkansas may find themselves without access to the treatment		
17	they need to relieve illness and suffering. Therefore, an emergency is		
18	declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the		
19	preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective		
20	on:		
21	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
22	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it		
23	shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which		
24	the Governor may veto the bill; or		
25	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden,
