14	they need to relieve illness and suffering. Therefore, an emergency is
15	declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the
16	preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective
17	on:
18	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
19	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it
20	shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which
21	the Governor may veto the bill; or
22	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden,
23	it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides the veto.
