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20	SECTION 1. <u>Purpose.</u>	
21	The purposes of this act are:	
22	(1) To study the status of the nursing	and nurse educator shortage in
23	Arkansas and the economic impact of these shor	tages on the healthcare

25	(2) To project the need for nurses and	nurse educators in the state

7	nursing workforce needs of the state to the Legislative Council by November	
8	<u>1, 2004.</u>	
9	(c) The commission shall expire on June 30, 2005.	
10	(d) Legislator members shall be entitled to reimbursement for expenses	
11	and per diem at the same rate and from the same source as provided by law for	
12	members of the General Assembly attending meetings of interim committees.	
13	(e) The commission shall select a chairperson from its voting	
14	membership.	
15	(f)(1) A majority of the voting membership of the commission shall	
16	constitute a quorum.	
17	(2) A majority vote of those voting members present shall be	
18	required for any action of the commission.	
19	(g) Vacancies on the commission due to death, resignation, or other	
20	causes shall be filled in the same manner as is provided in this act for	
21	<u>i ni ti al appoi ntments.</u>	
22	(h) Commission meetings shall be held in Pulaski County, Arkansas.	
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24	SECTION 3. <u>EMERGENCY CLAUSE</u> . It is found and determined by the	
25	General Assembly that the Arkansas Legislative Commission on Nursing created	
26	by Act 1465 of 2001 expires June 30, 2003; that its work should continue for	
27	another biennium; and that unless this emergency clause is adopted there will	
28	be a gap in its work effort and its momentum might be lost. Therefore, an	
29	emergency is declared to exist and this act being necessary for the	
30	preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective on	
31	Jul y 1, 2003.	
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
