25 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
26

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - SPATIAL INFORMATION SYSTEMS DEGREE PROGRAM.

27 There is hereby appropriated, to the University of Arkansas at Monticello, to
28 be payable from the University of Arkansas at Monticello Fund, for providing
29 additional support for the Spatial Information Systems Degree Program of the
30 University of Arkansas at Monticello which shall be supplemental and in
31 addition to those funds appropriated in Section 3 of Act 283 of 2001, the

4 SECTION 2. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 5 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUNDING
 6 TRANSFER.Immediately upon the effective date of this act, the Chief Fiscal
 7 Officer of the State shall transfer on his books and those of the State
 8 Treasurer the sum of three hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$375,000)
 9 from the General Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund to the University of Arkansas
 10 at Monticello Fund to provide funds for the appropriation provided herein.
 11

12 SECTION 3. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
 13 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
 14 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
 15 restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
 16 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
 17 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures
 18 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
 19 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
 20 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
 21 with in disbursement of said funds.
 22

23 SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
 24 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
 25 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
 26 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
 27 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
 28 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
 29 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
 30 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
 31

32 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
 33 Assembly, that funds provided by the General Assembly for the operations of
 34 the University of Arkansas at Monticello are, due to unforeseen
 35 circumstances, insufficient for the University of Arkansas at Monticello to
 36 continue to provide essential governmental services; that the provisions of

1 this act will provide the necessary monies for the University of Arkansas at
2 Monticello to continue such services; and that a delay in the effective date
3 of this Act could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and
4 provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is
5 hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate
6 preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force
7 and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.

8 If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become
9 effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor
10 may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
11 overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides
12 the veto.

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
