25	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the	
26	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the environmental policy for	
27	Arkansas is carried out by the Pollution Control and Ecology Commission; that	
28	expanding the membership of the Commission with certain professional	
29	technical experts will promote a more effective environmental policy for	
30	Arkansas; that laws affecting state agencies are more effective if	
31	implemented at the beginning of the fiscal year for state government; and it	
32	necessary for this act to become effective on that date. Therefore, an	
33	emergency is declared to exist and this act being necessary for the	
34	preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall become effective on	
35	July 1, 2003.
