12	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 21-4-204(e), concerning the annual leave
13	for state employees under the Uniform Attendance and Leave Policy Act, is

15	(e)(l)(A) Annual leave shall be cumulative. No employee shall have
16	more than thirty (30) days annual leave accumulated at the end of each
17	calendar year. However, the thirty-day accumulative annual leave may exceed
18	thirty (30) days prior to the end of the calendar year.

(ii) However, payments to fire or emergency service employees for unused leave at retirement under §§ 21-4-501 through 21-4-504 shall be calculated at the 120-day maximum rate for regular state employees. (2)(A)(3)(A) An employee shall be required to furnish a certificate from an attending physician for five (5) or more consecutive days of sick leave. An agency which has a written procedure to identify patterns of sick leave usage may require an employee to furnish a certificate from an attending physician for any use of sick leave. (B) A certificate from a Christian Science practitioner listed in The Christian Science Journal may be submitted in lieu of a physician's certificate.

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
