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- SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-60-504(b), concerning religious objections to immunization of college and university students, is amended to read as follows:
 - (b) The provisions of this subchapter shall not apply if the individual furnishes to the college or university written proof from a church or denomination official that the immunization conflicts with the religious tenets and practices of the recognized church or religious denomination of which the individual is an adherent or member a signed, notarized statement that the immunization conflicts with the religious or philosophical beliefs of the individual.

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- SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 20-78-206(a)(2)(B), concerning exemptions from immunization in child care facilities, is amended to read as follows:
- 29 (B)(i) The provisions of subdivision (a)(2)(A) of this
 30 section pertaining to immunizations shall not apply if the parents or legal
 31 guardian of that child object thereto on the grounds that such immunization
 32 conflicts with the religious tenets and practices of a recognized church or
 33 religious denomination of which or philosophical beliefs of the parent or
 34 guardian is an adherent or member.
