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21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
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23	SECTION 1. APPROPRIATIONS - ARKANSAS ARCHEOLOGICAL SURVEY - TWO YEAR PILOT	
24	PROGRAM. There is hereby appropriated, to the University of Arkansas, to be	
25	payable from the General Improvement Fund or its successor fund or fund	
26	26 accounts, the following:	
27	(A) For a two (2) year pilot program for the Arka	ansas Archeological Survey
28	to help local organizations to identify and preserve	e poorly documented
29	cemeteries in Arkansas where African Americans are interred using	
30	archeological and historical research methods, the sum of	
31	\$200,000.	
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33	SECTION 2. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORA	ATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
34	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND	TEMPORARY LAW.
35	ARCHEOLOGICAL SURVEY CONTRACT. The Archeological Survey shall contract with	
36	the Arkansas Humanities Council to grant funds to local organizations and	

1 provide training and assistance in historical research methods and the 2 Arkansas Archeological Survey shall provide assistance in archeological methods, as needed. 3 4 SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 5 6 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 7 LEGISLATIVE PURPOSE. The General Assembly declares that this act is 8 necessary to assist cemetery associations, local community service organizations, churches, families and other interested groups to reclaim, 9 10 document and preserve poorly maintained cemeteries in Arkansas where African 11 Americans are interred. These sites are invaluable cultural and historical 12 resources for the citizens of Arkansas. 13 SECTION 4. DISBURSEMENT CONTROLS. (A) No contract may be awarded nor 14 15 obligations otherwise incurred in relation to the project or projects 16 described herein in excess of the State Treasury funds actually available therefor as provided by law. Provided, however, that institutions and 17 18 agencies listed herein shall have the authority to accept and use grants and 19 donations including Federal funds, and to use its unobligated cash income or funds, or both available to it, for the purpose of supplementing the State 20 21 Treasury funds for financing the entire costs of the project or projects 22 enumerated herein. Provided further, that the appropriations and funds 23 otherwise provided by the General Assembly for Maintenance and General 24 Operations of the agency or institutions receiving appropriation herein shall 25 not be used for any of the purposes as appropriated in this act. 26 (B) The restrictions of any applicable provisions of the State Purchasing 27 Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue 28 Stabilization Law and any other applicable fiscal control laws of this State 29 and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, 30 as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of any 31 funds provided by this act unless specifically provided otherwise by law. 32 SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 33 34 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 35 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 36 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations

1	and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by	
2	the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral	
3	testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or	
4	Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.	
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6	SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General	
7	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the	
8	appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the	
9	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2003 is essential to the operation of	
10	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in	
11	the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective	
12	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2003 could work irreparable harm upon the	
13	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.	
14	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being	
15	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and	
16	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2003.	
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
