6	(a) The offices of Justice of the Supreme Court, Judge of the Court

9	(b)(1)(A)(i) The general elections for When there are more than two		
10	(2) candidates for a judicial office, the candidates shall be placed on a		
11	ballot for election at a primary election for nonpartisan judicial offices		
12	shall to be held on the same dates and at the same times and places as

14	(ii)(a) If no candidate receives a majority of the
