21	(2) "State agency" means any office, department, board,		
22	commission, bureau, division, public corporation, agency, or instrumentality		
23	of this state.

25	25-10-403. Agency contracting - Diversity.		
26	(a) State agencies shall include in all requests for proposals and		
27	requests for qualifications, language that encourages minority participation		
28	in each request for proposals and request for qualifications issued by the		
29	agency.		
30	(b)(1) State agency requests for proposals and requests for		
31	qualifications shall take into consideration minority inclusion in the		
32	proposed project.		
33	(2) Requests for proposals and requests for qualifications shall		
34	provide that an applicant unable to include minority owned businesses may		
35	explain the circumstances preventing minority inclusion.

2	(a)(1) The Director of the Office of State Procurement of the			
3	Department of Finance and Administration shall track data regarding minority			
4	participation in each state agency request for proposal and request for			
5	qualifications that exceeds twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000).			
6	(2) The data shall include, but not be limited to, information			
7	regarding:			
8	(A) The dollar amounts for each contract awarded to a			
9	minority owned business;			
10	(B) The total dollar amount spent on contracts by each			
11	state agency;			
12	(C) The number of advertisements for each request for			
13	proposal;			
14	(D) The method of publication of each advertisement;			
15	(C) The number and percentage of minority owned business			
16	applications for each request for proposal and request for qualifications;			
17	(E) The number and percentage of minority owned businesses			
18	awarded contracts by the agency;			
19	(F) The number and percentage of minority owned business			
20	applicants not awarded contracts by the agency; and			
21	(G) The reasons for both making and denying awards to			
22	minority owned businesses.			
23	(b) The Director of the Office of State Procurement shall report the			
24	data required under subsection (a) of this section semiannually to the			
25	Governor and to the cochairs of the Legislative Council and to the			
26	Legislative Joint Audit Committee.			
27	(c)(1) Each state agency shall include in its budget report to the			
28	Joint Budget Committee of the Legislative Council a listing of all contracts			
29	in amounts exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) awarded to			
30	minority owned businesses.			
31	(2) The vice-president or vice-chancellor for finance of each			
32	state college and university shall include in his or her budget report to the			
33	Joint Budget Committee of the Legislative Council a listing of all contracts			
34	in amounts exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) awarded to

2	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 15-4-303 is amended to read as follows:			
3	15-4-303. Advisory Council.			
4	(a) The Division of Minority Business Enterprise of the Department of			
5	Economic Development shall be represented by a statewide Minority Business			
6	Advisory Council to serve under the management of the division.			
7	(b) The council shall consist of seven (7) members.			
8	(c) $\underline{(1)}$ The Governor shall appoint three (3) members of the council			
9	with the advice and consent of the Senate.			
10	(2) The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint two			
11	(2) members of the council.			
12	(3) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint			
13	two (2) members of the council.			
14	(d) Except as otherwise provided by law, members of the council shall			
15	serve without compensation.			
16	(e) $\underline{(1)}$ The term of office of the council shall be at the pleasure of			
17	the Governor appointing officer.			
18	(2) On the effective date of this subdivision, the terms of			
19	present members of the council shall expire.
