21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
22

23 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 16-81-106(g), concerning persons with  
24 authority to arrest, is amended to read as follows:

25 (g) The following persons employed as full-time law enforcement  
26 officers by the federal, state, county, or municipal government, who are  
27 empowered to effect an arrest with or without warrant for violations of the  
28 United States Code and who are authorized to carry firearms in the  
29 performance of their duties, shall be empowered to act as officers for the  
30 arrest of offenders against the laws of this state and shall enjoy the same  
31 immunity, if any, to the same extent and under the same circumstances as  
32 certified state law enforcement officers:

- 33 (1) Federal Bureau of Investigation special agents;  
34 (2) United States Secret Service special agents;  
35 (3) Immigration and Naturalization Service special agents,  
36 investigators, and patrol officers;

- 1 (4) United States Marshals Service deputies;
- 2 (5) Drug Enforcement Administration special agents;
- 3 (6) United States postal inspectors;
- 4 (7) United States Customs Service special agents, inspectors,
- 5 and patrol officers;
- 6 (8) United States General Services Administration special
- 7 agents;
- 8 (9) United States Department of Agriculture special agents;
- 9 (10) Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms special agents;
- 10 (11) Internal Revenue Service special agents and inspectors;
- 11 (12) Certified law enforcement officers of the Department of the
- 12 Interior, National Park Service; ~~and~~
- 13 (13) Members of federal, state, county, municipal, and
- 14 prosecuting attorneys' drug task forces; and
- 15 (14) Persons designated as a policeman or law enforcement
- 16 security officer with the Federal Protective Service.
