# For An Act To Be Entitled <br> AN ACT TO INCREASE PENALTIES UNDER THE ARKANSAS HOT CHECK LAW; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES. 

## Subtitle

AN ACT TO INCREASE PENALTIES UNDER THE ARKANSAS HOT CHECK LAW.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 5-37-305(a), concerning penalties for violating the Arkansas Hot Check Law, is amended to read as follows:
(a) Upon a determination of guilt, in the event that the order, draft, check, or other form of presentment involving the transmission of account information is two hundred dollars (\$200) or less, the penalties shall be as follows:
(1)(A) First Offense. A fine of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) one hundred fifty dollars (\$150) nor more than five hundred dollars $(\$ 500)$ six hundred dollars (\$600) or imprisonment in the county jail or regional detention facility not to exceed thirty (30) days, or both;
(B) At the request of the prosecuting attorney, the person may be ordered to attend a class on budgeting and checkbook balancing not to exceed two (2) night per week for two (2) weeks;
(2) (A) Second Offense. A fine of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100) two hundred dollars (\$200) nor more than one thousand dollars $(\$ 1,000)$ one thousand one hundred dollars ( $\$ 1,100$ ) or imprisonment in the county jail or regional detention facility not to exceed ninety (90) days, or both;
(B) At the request of the prosecuting attorney, the person may be ordered to attend a class on budgeting and checkbook balancing not to exceed two (2) nights per week for four (4) weeks;
(3)(A) Third and Subsequent Offenses. A fine of not less than two hundred dollars (\$200) four hundred dollars (\$400) nor more than thousand dollars ( $\$ 2,000$ ) two thousand five hundred dollars $(\$ 2,500)$ or imprisonment in the county jail or regional detention facility not to exceed one (1) year, or both;
(B) At the request of the prosecuting attorney, the person may be ordered to attend a class on budgeting and checkbook balancing not to exceed two (2) night per weeks for three (3) months;
