18	WHEREAS, President Ronald Wilson Reagan, a man of humble background,	
19	worked throughout his life serving freedom and advancing the public good,	
20	having been employed as an entertainer, union leader, corporate spokesman,	
21	Governor of California, and President of the United States; and	
22		
23	WHEREAS, Ronald Reagan served with honor and distinction for two terms	3
24	as the 40th President of the United States of America, the second in which h	ne
25	earned the confidence of three-fifths of the electorate and was victorious i	in
26	49 of the 50 states in the general election, a record unsurpassed in the	
27	history of American presidential elections; and	
28		
29	WHEREAS, in 1981, when Ronald Reagan was inaugurated President, he	
30	inherited a disillusioned nation shackled by rampant inflation and high	
31	unemployment; and

33	WHEREAS, during Mr. Reagan's presidency, he worked in a bipartisan	
34	manner to enact his bold agenda of restoring accountability and common sense	3
35	to government, which led to an unprecedented economic expansion and	
36	opportunity for millions of Americans; and

2	WHEREAS, Mr. Reagan's commitment to an active social policy agenda for
3	the nation's children helped lower crime and drug use in our neighborhoods;

6	WHEREAS, President Reagan's commitment to our armed forces contributed
7	to the restoration of pride in America, her values and those cherished by the
8	free world, and prepared America's armed forces to win the Gulf War; and

10	WHEREAS, President Reagan's vision of "peace through strength" led to
11	the end of the Cold War and the ultimate demise of the Soviet Union,
12	guaranteeing basic human rights for millions of people; and
13	
14	WHEREAS, on February 6, 2003, Ronald Reagan will have reached the age
15	of ninety-two years.

17	NOW THEREFORE,
18	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
19	STATE OF ARKANSAS:
