(b) Determining the number of personnel to be employed by a state agency is 20 21 the prerogative of the General Assembly and is usually accomplished by 22 delineating the maximum number of personnel by identifying the job titles and 23 the maximum grade or salary attached to those salaries. The General Assembly 24 has determined that the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences could be 25 operated more efficiently if some flexibility is given to that institution. 26 That flexibility is being accomplished by providing growth pools in 27 subsection (a) of this section and since the General Assembly has granted the 28 institution broad powers under the growth pool concept, it is both necessary 29 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight of the 30 utilization of the growth pool by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council in the utilization of the growth pool.
