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1 2 SECTION 2. The additional tax levied by this act shall be computed, 3 collected, and remitted in the same manner and at the same time as is 4 provided by law for other gross receipts taxes and compensating use taxes. 5 6 SECTION 3. The net revenues derived from the additional taxes levied 7 in this act shall be used exclusively for Medicaid matching funds for 8 Personal Care and ElderChoices services for homemaker, respite care, and 9 chore services. 10 11 SECTION 4. The taxes levied in this act shall be in effect on and 12 after the first day of the second calendar month after the calendar month in 13 which this act becomes effective. 14 15 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 16 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the state is experiencing 17 budgetary hardships due to a decline in revenues of the state; that unless new revenues are provided for Medicaid matching funds for Personal Care and 18 ElderChoices services for homemaker, respite care, and chore services, 19 20 federal Medicaid matching funds may be lost, and that this act is immediately 21 necessary to ensure that such matching funds will not be lost and those 22 services curtailed. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this 23 act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, 24 health, and safety shall become effective on: 25 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor; 26 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, 27 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the 28 bill; or 29 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is 30 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto. 31 32 33 34 35 36
