11	AN ACT TO CREATE THE ARKANSAS COMMISSION FOR	
12	COORDINATION OF EDUCATIONAL EFFORTS; AND FOR	
13	OTHER PURPOSES.

16	AN ACT TO CREATE THE ARKANSAS COMMISSION	
17	FOR COORDINATION OF EDUCATIONAL EFFORTS.	
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19		
20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
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22	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 1, is amended to add an	
23	additional subchapter to read as follows:	
24	6-1-301. Arkansas Commission for Coordination of Educational Efforts.	
25	(a) There is created the "Arkansas Commission for Coordination of	
26	Educational Efforts".	
27	(b) The commission is composed of the following members:	
28	(1) The Director of the Department of Higher Education;	
29	(2) The Director of the Department of Education;	
30	(3) The Director of the Department of Workforce Education;	
31	(4) The Director of the Department of Economic Development;	
32	(5) The Vice President for Agriculture at the University of	
33	Arkansas at Fayetteville;	
34	(6) The Governor or the Governor's designee;	
35	(7) One (1) public school administrator appointed by the	
36	Governor;	

1	(8) One (1) public school teacher appointed by the Governor;
2	(9) One (1) president or chancellor of a four-year university
3	appointed by the Presidents Council;
4	(10) One (1) president or chancellor of a two-year college or
5	two-year branch of a four-year university appointed by the Presidents
6	Council;
7	(11) One (1) member of the board of trustees of a four-year
8	$\underline{\text{university}}$ or system of colleges and universities appointed by the $\underline{\text{Presidents}}$
9	Council;
10	(12) One (1) member of the board of trustees of a two-year
11	college or branch appointed by the Presidents Council;
12	(13) One (1) member appointed by the President Pro Tempore of
13	the Senate from a list of three (3) nominees submitted by the Executive
14	Director of the Arkansas Education Association;
15	(14) One (1) member appointed by the Speaker of the House of
16	Representatives from a list of three (3) nominees submitted by the Executive
17	Director of the Arkansas Association of Educational Administrators; and
18	(15) One (1) member appointed jointly by the Speaker of the
19	House and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate from a list of three (3)
20	nominees submitted by the Executive Director of the Arkansas School Boards
21	Association.
22	(c)(l) Each member of the commission shall be a resident of the State
23	of Arkansas throughout his or her term on the commission.
24	(2) None of the members appointed from the board of trustees of
25	a college or university shall be from an institution from which the president
26	or chancellor of the institution is serving on the commission.
27	(d) The appointed members of the commission shall serve staggered
28	terms of four (4) years.
29	(e) If a vacancy occurs in an appointed position, the vacancy shall be
30	filled for the unexpired term by an appointment made in the same manner as
31	the original appointment.
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33	6-1-302. Organization and operation.
34	(a) The Arkansas Commission for Coordination of Educational Efforts
35	shall annually elect a chair, a vice chair, and a secretary.
36	(b)(1) The commission shall meet at least quarterly each year.

1	Special meetings may be held at the call of the chair, as needed.
2	(2) The commission shall meet at such times and places that the
3	chair deems necessary, but no meeting shall be held outside the State of
4	Arkansas.
5	(c) A quorum for conducting business is eight (8) members of the
6	commission.
7	(d) The Department of Education shall provide staff support for the
8	commission.
9	(e) The members of the commission may receive expense reimbursement in
10	accordance with § 25-16-902. The expense reimbursement shall be paid by the
11	Department of Education from moneys available for that purpose.
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13	6-1-303. Duties.
14	(a) The Arkansas Commission for Coordination of Educational Efforts
15	$\underline{\text{shall}}$ study and recommend policies related to the improvement of $\underline{\text{coordination}}$
16	among and between the levels of education from pre-kindergarten to the
17	graduate level.
18	(b)(1) The commission shall give priority to improvements benefiting
19	students at all levels of education in Arkansas.
20	(2) The commission shall work to benefit the State of Arkansas
21	and improve the economy of the state by recommending a more efficient system
22	of education.
23	(c) The commission shall:
24	(1) Recommend policies on concurrent enrollment of high school
25	students in college courses;
26	(2) Make recommendations related to a common calendar for all
27	public schools and institutions of higher education;
28	(3) Study the various delivery systems of distance learning and
29	recommend ways to improve and make more efficient a delivery system for
30	Arkansas;
31	(4) Recommend ways that the public schools, the Department of
32	$\underline{\text{Education,}}$ the Department of Higher Education, and the institutions of $\underline{\text{higher}}$
33	education can improve working relationships in order to improve the
34	effectiveness of teaching for the public schools;
35	(5)(A) Recommend ways of improving the transfer of credit from
36	institution to institution for the benefit of the student.

1	(B) This includes recommendations for improving the
2	transfer from two-year to four-year institutions as well as the transfer
3	among two-year institutions and four-year institutions;
4	(6) Make recommendations related to aligning the curriculum from
5	kindergarten through the bachelor's level in colleges and universities;
6	(7) Recommend ways of improving the link between educational
7	efforts and economic development for Arkansas;
8	(8) Recommend priorities for the funding of education;
9	(9) Review all current scholarship programs of the state and
10	institutions of higher education and make recommendations for improving
11	future scholarship programs;
12	(10) Make recommendations related to the future need for
13	remediation of beginning college students; and
14	(11) Recommend any other improvements in education at any level
15	to benefit students and the state.
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17	6-1-304. Reporting requirements.
18	(a)(1) The Arkansas Commission for Coordination of Educational Efforts
19	shall submit an annual report to the Governor, Senate and House Committees on
20	Education, the State Board of Education, the Arkansas Higher Education
21	Coordinating Board, and to all boards of trustees of public institutions of
22	higher education.
23	(2) Additional reports shall be given to committees of the
24	General Assembly upon request of a committee.
25	(b) All state agencies, institutions of higher education, and public
26	schools shall cooperate with the commission and supply data and information
27	needed by the commission in a timely manner.
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29	SECTION 2. Special provisions.
30	(a) The first meeting of the Arkansas Commission for Coordination of
31	Educational Efforts shall be held within thirty (30) days after the effective
32	date of this act.
33	(b) The Director of the Department of Education shall call the first
34	meeting of the commission and shall preside at the meeting until the
35	commission elects a chair.
36	(c) At the first meeting the commission shall elect a chair a

1	vicechair, and a secretary.
2	(d) The initial terms of the appointed members of the commission shall
3	be determined by lot so that two (2) members have a one-year term, two (2)
4	members have a two-year term, two (2) members have a three-year term, and
5	three (3) members have a four-year term.
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7	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
8	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Arkansas Supreme Court in
9	Lake View School District No. 25 v. Huckabee, 351 Ark. 31 (2002) declared the
10	now existing system of education to be unconstitutional because it is both
11	inequitable and inadequate; that educational reforms applied to public
12	schools has an effect on other segments of the state's educational system;
13	that the cooperation of all segments of the educational system is necessary
14	to ensure the success of educational reforms; that to foster cooperation this
15	act creates the Arkansas Commission for Coordination of Educational Efforts;
16	and that this act is immediately necessary to assist in the enhancement of
17	the state's educational system. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist
18	and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public
19	peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:
20	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
21	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
22	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
23	bill; or
24	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
25	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
