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13 SECTION 3. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 14 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 15 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the 16 restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and 17 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures 18 19 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of 20 21 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied 22 with in disbursement of said funds.

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SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly 24 25 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained 26 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act 27 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations 28 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by 29 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral 30 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or 31 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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33 <u>SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General</u> 34 <u>Assembly, that providing state assistance for monthly contributions directly</u> 35 <u>to the Public School Employees Health Insurance Program as administered by</u> 36 the Department of Finance and Administration is needed to ensure financial

2	emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the	
3	immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in

6	effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor
