## For An Act To Be Entitled

AN ACT TO PROHIBIT REMEDIAL STUDENTS FROM ADMISSION TO DEGREE PROGRAMS AT FOUR-YEAR COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES IN ARKANSAS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-61-110(a), concerning testing of entering freshmen for remedial courses, is amended to read as follows:
(a)(1) Beginning with the 2004-2005 academic year, all first-time entering freshmen at all state-supported four-year colleges and universities in Arkansas shall be admitted provisionally.
(2) All first-time entering freshmen at all state-supported colleges and universities in Arkansas who are admitted to enroll in all associate or bachelor's degree programs shall be tested by the admitting institution for purposes of placement in either college-level credit courses in English and mathematics or remedial courses in English composition, reading, and mathematics.
(3)(A) No high school graduate provisionally admitted to a state-supported four-year college or university in Arkansas who is required

under subdivision (a)(2) of this section to take a remedial course or courses
may continue enrollment at a four-year college or university until all
remedial requirements have been met at an institution other than a state-
supported four-year college or university in Arkansas.
    (B) However, the student may be admitted conditionally, if
the student:
                            (i) Achieves a score of twenty-two (22) or higher on
the American College Test composite or its equivalent as defined by the
Department of Higher Education; and
                            (ii) Is required to take only one (l) remedial
course.
