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     active members who have previously elected to eliminate member contributions
     may make an irrevocable election to make future contributions to the
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     retirement system.
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                       (B) If the election is made prior to the preparation of
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     the first salary payment to the member in the fiscal year, the election will
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     become effective immediately. If the election is made after the preparation
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     of the first payroll containing the first salary payment to the member in the
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     fiscal year, the election shall be effective July 1 of the next fiscal year.
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                 (2)(3) For a former inactive member, the election shall be made
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     within one (1) year of the effective date the member is considered an active
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     member. The election shall be effective the earlier of the preparation of the
     payroll containing the first salary payment upon reentry or the July 1 next
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     following the date the election is filed with the system. If no election is
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     made within one (1) year, the member's status prior to reentry will remain in
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     effect.
