## For An Act To Be Entitled

an act to Create a pilot Program to study the EFFECT OF REDUCING TEACHER-STUDENT RATIOS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

## Subtitle

AN ACT TO CREATE A PILOT PROGRAM TO STUDY THE EFFECT OF REDUCING TEACHERSTUDENT RATIOS.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 15 Subchapter 1 is amended to add two additional sections to read as follows:

6-15-102. Findings - - Purpose.
(a) The General Assembly finds that:
(1) Consultants working with the Joint Committee on Educational

Adequacy reported national research that indicates student performance is improved by the reduction of teacher-student ratios from one-to-twenty to one-to-eighteen and from one-to-twenty to one-to-fifteen;
(2) A reduction in the teacher-student ratio will require a significant increase in funding; and
(3) Before making a decision to lower the teacher-student ratio in Arkansas, sufficient information should be available to allow the General Assembly to determine whether such a reduction would justify the added dollars required.
(b) The pilot program is intended to determine the impact that reducing the teacher-student ratio from one-to-twenty to one-to-eighteen and

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from one-to-twenty to one-to-fifteen would have on grades kindergarten
through three (K-3).
    6-15-103. Pilot project - - Teacher-student ratios.
    (a) During the 2004-2005 school year, the Department of Education
shall establish a pilot program to study the educational effects of reducing
teacher-student ratios in grades kindergarten through three (K-3).
    (b)(l)(A) The Department of Education shall select sixteen (16)
elementary schools for the pilot project.
    (B) Eight (8) of the schools in the pilot project shall be
have its teacher-student ratios reduced to one-to-fifteen.
    (C) Eight (8) of the schools in the pilot project shall be
have its teacher-student ratios reduced to one-to-eighteen.
    (2) The Department of Education shall select four (4) schools
from each congressional district with the following characteristics:
    (A) One (1) school in each congressional district from a
school district with each of the following enrollment categories:
    (i) Five thousand \((5,000)\) or more students;
    (ii) One thousand five hundred \((1,500)\) to four
thousand nine hundred ninety-nine \((4,999)\) students;
    (iii) Seven hundred fifty (750) to one thousand four
hundred ninety-nine \((1,499)\) students; and
    (iv) Below seven hundred fifty (750) students;
    (B) At least two (2) classes at each grade from
kindergarten through three (K-3); and
            (C) Pilot and control classes composed of identical
percentages of students who:
    (i) Qualify for free or reduced-1unch fees; or
    (ii) Are below two hundred percent (200\%) of the
federal poverty level.
    (c)(l) The Department of Education shall consult with the Department
of Higher Education to select one (l) Arkansas university to assist and study
the pilot project schools in each congressional district.
    (2) (A) Each selected university shall appoint a qualified
faculty member or graduate student to represent the university in the pilot
project.
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(B) Each selected university shall provide the selected faculty member or graduate student with sufficient release time to assist effectively in the project.
(d)(1) After the pilot project schools and universities have been selected, the Department of Education shall convene a meeting of persons from each school and university to outline the pilot research project.
(2) The meeting shall be held during the summer of 2004 to prepare for the 2004-2005 school year.
(3) In consultation with the Department of Education, the research group shall outline the details of a pilot program that will meet research standards necessary to draw valid conclusions based on the outcome data from the project.
(4) During the project year, the research groups may meet as the members deem necessary.
(e)(l)(A) Each university shall prepare a report on the pilot project for the public schools under study by that university.
(B)(i) Early in the project year, the pilot project
schools and universities shall design a format for the reports.
(ii) The final report from all schools shall employ the format designed under subdivision (e)(1)(A)(i) of this section.
(2) The Department of Education shall compile a summary report covering all the pilot project schools.
(f) On or before September 1, 2005, the Department of Education shall report the results of the pilot project to the Governor, the State Board of Education, the Legislative Council, and the House and Senate Interim Committees on Education.
