36		SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INC	ORPORA	ATED II	NTO THE ARKANSAS

CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CERTIFIED TEACHERS IN SPECIAL SETTINGS BONUS FUNDING PROVISION. During the 2004-05 fiscal year each school district that contracts with or otherwise receives teaching services for its students shall pay to the applicable provider of service a one-time bonus in an amount equal to \$2,500 for each full time equivalent certified teacher employed by the provider that is providing the services to school district students. Immediately upon receiving the monies from the school district the provider of service shall make available the \$2,500 one-time bonus to each of its full time equivalent certified teachers that are providing the services to school district students. Further, the school district shall provide the one-time bonus in an amount equal to \$2,500 per full time equivalent certified teacher to those teachers providing Adult Education services to students of the school district.

SECTION 6. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

34 <u>SECTION 8. EMERGENCY CLAUSE.</u> It is found and determined by the General
35 <u>Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the</u>
36 <u>appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that due to the</u>

1	November 2002 Arkansas Supreme Court decision regarding the inadequacy of
2	Arkansas public schools the effectiveness of this Act on the date of its
3	passage and approval is essential to the operation of the agency for which
4	the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an
5	extension of the Second Extraordinary Session, the delay in the effective
6	date of this Act beyond the date of its passage and approval could work
7	irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential
8	governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist
9	and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
10	peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after the
11	date of its passage and approval.
12	_ If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become
13	effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor
14	may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
15	overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides
16	the veto.
