23	SECTION 1. (a	) The General Assembly recognizes the	mandate of the	
24	Arkansas Supreme Cou	rt and the recommendation of the Joint	Committee on	
25	Educational Adequacy	to create a new system of teacher com	pensation that	<u>will</u>
26	reflect the education	nal needs of the students in Arkansas.		
27	(b) The Gener	al Assembly also recognizes that in or	der to create a	new
28	teacher compensation	system, a pilot program must be devel	oped and monito	red.
29	(c) The Gener	al Assembly further recognizes that, w	hile any study	
30	performed is an inte	gral component towards satisfying the	requirements	
31	imposed by the Arkan	sas Supreme Court's decision in the La	ke View case, t	<u>he</u>
32	General Assembly is	ultimately responsible for making the	final determina	tion
33	of what satisfies th	e constitutional requirements.

35	SECTION 2. (a	)(1) There is created a task force to	be known as th	<u>e</u>
36	Task Force on Teache	r Compensation.

1	(2) The work of the task force will result in a new office
2	within the Arkansas Department of Education, called the Arkansas Teacher
3	Excellence Initiative.
4	(3) The on-going mission of Arkansas Teacher Excellence
5	Initiative will be to monitor and assure that the school-based performance
6	award and knowledge and skill-based pay programs continue to achieve their
7	mission and objectives, ultimately leading to adequate education and improved
8	student learning and achievement.
9	(b)(1) The task force shall consist of sixteen (16) members to be
10	appointed by the Director of the Department of Education as follows:
11	(A) Two (2) members of the Arkansas Education Association;
12	(B) Two (2) members of the Arkansas Association of
13	Educational Administrators;
14	(C) Two (2) members of the Arkansas School Boards
15	Association;
16	(D) Two (2) members of the Arkansas State Chamber of
17	Commerce;
18	(E) Two (2) members who are representative of rural
19	schools;
20	(F) Two (2) members of the Arkansas Parent Teacher
21	Association;
22	(G) Two (2) teachers who have received a Milken Educator
23	Award;
24	(H) One (1) member of the Arkansas Association of
25	Professional Educators; and
26	(I) The director or his proxy in a nonvoting ex officio
27	capacity.
28	(2) To the extent practicable, the director shall appoint to the
29	task force authorized by this act those individuals who were appointed to the
30	Ad Hoc Subcommittee of Educational Stakeholders created by the Joint
31	Committee on Educational Adequacy created by Act 94 of 2003.
32	(c) The interim chair of the task force shall be appointed by the
33	director until the task force elects its own officers.
34	(d) If a vacancy occurs in an appointed position for any reason, the
35	vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.
36	(e)(1) The task force shall meet upon call of the chair of the task

1	force.
2	(2) Eight (8) members of the task force shall constitute a
3	quorum for the purpose of transacting business.
4	(3) A quorum is required for any action of the task force.
5	(f) The mission of the task force is to implement the recommendations
6	in the Reports and Recommendations of the Joint Committee on Educational
7	Adequacy of the Arkansas General Assembly, September 1, 2003, by assuring
8	that teachers acquire and use the knowledge and skills that will lead to
9	improved student learning and achievement.
10	(g) Specifically, the task force shall:
11	(1) Review the opinion of the Arkansas Supreme Court in the
12	matter of Lake View School District No. 25 of Phillips County, Arkansas, et
13	al., vs. Governor Mike Huckabee, et al. issued on November 21, 2002, and use
14	the opinion and other legal precedent cited by the court in the task force's
15	deliberations;
16	(2) Review the Reports and Recommendations of the Joint
17	Committee on Educational Adequacy of the Arkansas General Assembly, September
18	<u>1, 2003;</u>
19	(3) Develop and implement a school-based performance award
20	<pre>program;</pre>
21	(4) Develop, pilot, and implement a knowledge and skills-based
22	pay program;
23	(5) Develop, pilot, and implement an assessment process to
24	assess teacher knowledge and skills that will be used to place teachers in
25	performance categories in the knowledge and skill-based pay program; and
26	(6) Align all professional development programs around the
27	acquisition and deployment of teacher knowledge and skills that will yield
28	continuous improvement in student learning and achievement.
29	(h)(1) The task force will accomplish the following milestones with
30	respect to school-based performance awards the first year, which shall be
31	January 2004 through August 2004:
32	(A) Develop a school-based performance award program;
33	(B) Adapt the current measuring performance honors program
34	to the school-based performance award program; and
35	(C) Develop the school-based performance award program for
36	implementation beginning in the 2004-2005 school year.

1	(2) The task force, in cooperation with the Department of
2	Education, will accomplish the following milestones with respect to
3	knowledge and skill-based pay program in the first year which shall be
4	January 2004 through August 2004:
5	(A) Establish a vision for instruction;
6	(B) Identify standards and rubrics for assessing teacher
7	knowledge and skills;
8	(C) Tailor such standards and rubrics;
9	(D) Define the assessment process;
10	(E) Pretest the assessment process;
11	(F) Conduct financial analyses to determine costs of the
12	knowledge and skill-based pay program;
13	(G) Develop administrative guidelines for the knowledge
L4	and skill-based pay program; and
15	(H) Establish the adders for subject area shortages and
16	geographical shortages recommended in the Reports and Recommendations of
17	the Joint Committee on Educational Adequacy of the Arkansas General
18	Assembly, September 1, 2003.
19	(3)(A) The task force, in cooperation with the Department of
20	Education, will accomplish the following milestones with respect to
21	school-based performance award program the second year which shall be
22	September 2004 through August 2005:
23	(i) Implement the school-based performance award
24	program;
25	(ii) Conduct a formative evaluation of the school-
26	based performance award program; and
27	(iii) Modify the school-based performance award
28	program if necessary. Evaluation and revision of the school-based
29	performance award program on an on-going basis will be the responsibility

31	(B) The task force, in cooperation with the Department of

4	revise the snowledge and skill-based pay program accordingly.
5	(4) The task force, in cooperation with the Department of
6	Education, will accomplish the following milestones with respect to knowledge
7	and skill-based pay program in the third year which shall be September 2005
8	through August 2006:
9	(A) Implement the knowledge and skill-based pay program;
10	(B) Conduct a formative evaluation of the implementation;
11	and and
12	(C) Recommend any changes in the knowledge and skill-based
13	pay program. Evaluation and revision of the knowledge and skill based pay
14	program on an on-going basis will be the responsibility of the Department of
15	Education.
16	(i)(1) The task force shall report its findings and recommendations on
17	three (3) occasions:
18	(A) On August 1, 2004, the task force shall give an
19	interim report to the House Interim Committee on Education and the Senate
20	Interim Committee on Education;
21	(B) On December 31, 2004, the task force shall give a
22	report and recommendations to the House Interim Committee on Education and
23	the Senate Interim Committee on Education that shall include any new
24	legislation that the task force believes should be considered by the Eighty
25	Fifth General Assembly; and
26	(C) On August 1, 2004, the task force shall submit its
27	final report and recommendations to the House Interim Committee on Education
28	and the Senate Interim Committee on Education.
29	(2) The report shall include for each recommendation, proposed
30	implementation schedules with timelines, specific steps, agencies and persons
31	responsible, and resources needed.
32	(3) Where feasible, all plans, measures, and initiatives shall
33	be proposed as recommendations for legislation or regulation.
34	(j) The Department of Education, the Department of Workforce
35	Education, and the Department of Higher Education shall provide the task
36	force with assistance as requested by the task force.

1	(k) The Attorney General is requested to provide assistance to the
2	task force as needed.
3	(1)(1) The task force may hire or contract with individuals or
4	entities, both within the state or from out-of-state, for the purpose of
5	obtaining staff or otherwise performing the duties of the task force to the
6	extent funding is appropriated and available for that purpose.
7	(2) The Department of Education shall furnish a reasonable
8	number of staff members to assist to the task force as may be requested by
9	the task force.
10	
11	SECTION 3. This act shall expire on September 1, 2005.
12	
13	SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
14	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Arkansas Supreme
15	Court has ruled that the current system of education in Arkansas is
16	inadequate and inequitable, and has instructed the General Assembly to
17	define what is necessary to provide an adequate and equitable education
18	for the children of Arkansas. A committee must be formed to determine
19	what constitutes an adequate education in Arkansas in sufficient time for
20	the General Assembly to take action before the termination of the court's
21	stay. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being
22	immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health,
23	and safety shall become effective on:
24	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
25	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
26	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
27	bill; or
28	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
29	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
