22	6-12-301. Creation	- Members generally.	
23	(a) If a county has	s a county school supervisor	or county board of
24	education designee as set	forth in § 6-12-201 (repeale	ed), the county shall
25	also have a county board o	of education composed of five	(5) members.
26	(b) The members of	county boards of education s	hall be qualified
27	electors who are known for	r their good moral character,	honesty, industry,
28	public spirit, and interes	st in education and who do no	ot hold any salaried or
29	fee office of the state or	r any political subdivision t	hereof.
30	(c) The term of off	fice for a member of the coun	ty board shall be five
31	(5) years, provided that a	any member of the county boar	ed shall hold office
32	until a successor has beer	n elected or appointed and qu	ualified.
33	(d) A member may su	ecced himself or herself.	
34	(e) The county boar	rd of election commissioners	shall notify each
35	person elected or appointed	ed as a member of the county	board in accordance
36	with the provisions of thi	is chapter.	

1	(f) A change of residence from the county zone shall automatically
2	disqualify the member from serving out the term for which the member was
3	elected.
4	(g)(1)(A) If a vacancy occurs on the county board, the vacancy shall
5	be filled by a vote of a majority of the remaining members.
6	(B) If the remaining members fail to fill a vacancy within
7	sixty (60) days after the date of vacancy, the vacancy shall be filled by
8	appointment by the county judge.
9	(C) If, as a result of several vacancies, only a minority
10	of the county board remains, then the county judge shall fill all the
11	vacancies by appointment.
12	(2) Appointed members shall have the same qualifications as
13	elected members, and each shall serve a full five-year term.
14	(h) The members of the county board shall serve without compensation
15	but shall be allowed actual expenses incurred in traveling to official
16	meetings of the county board and in the performance of the official business
17	of the county board. The amount of one hundred dollars (\$100), or so much
18	thereof as is needed, shall be allowed annually from the county general
19	school fund for this purpose. If, in the judgment of the county judge and the
20	unanimous opinion of the members of the county board, additional funds are
21	necessary, an additional one hundred dollars (\$100) may be allowed annually.
22	(i) Any person elected or appointed to serve as a member of the county
23	board on or before July 1, 2000, may complete the term for which the person
24	was elected and shall hold office until a successor has been appointed and
25	qualified.
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27	6-12-302. Members - Counties with only one school district.
28	(a) In counties having only one (1) school district, the board of
29	directors of that district shall act as the county board of education.
30	(b)(1) Each county board of education may hire the staff it deems
31	necessary and establish the salaries for that staff.
32	(2) The county board shall not hire a county school supervisor
33	or county board designee after the termination of employment of the county
34	school supervisor or county board designee employed after December 31, 1998.
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36	6-12-303. Oath.

1	(a) Within fifteen (15) days after the election or appointment, each
2	elected or appointed member of the county board of education shall subscribe
3	in writing to the following oath:
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5	"I, do hereby solemnly swear or affirm that I will support
6	the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the State of
7	Arkansas, and that I will not be financially interested, directly or
8	indirectly, in any contract made by the county board of which I am a member,
9	or by any board of school directors of the county, except for contracts for
10	materials bought on open competitive bid and let to the lowest bidder
11	conforming to specifications; and that I will faithfully discharge the duties
12	of a member of the county board of education, upon which I am about to
13	enter."
14	(b) The county clerk, upon receipt of the oaths for the county board
15	members, shall immediately commission these persons, and they shall enter at
16	once upon their duties as members of the county board.
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18	6-12-304. Meetings.
19	(a) The county board of education shall meet on the fourth Tuesday of
20	March, June, September, and December of each year and at other times as
21	meetings may be adjourned to or on call of the chairman, the county school
22	supervisor or county board designee, or any three (3) members of the county
23	board.
24	(b) Notice of called meetings must be given in writing to each member
25	of the county board.
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27	6-12-305. Organization.
28	During the meeting on the fourth Tuesday of September, the members of
29	the county board of education shall elect one (1) of its members as chair,
30	and the county board shall designate an ex officio secretary of the board.
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32	6-12-306. Powers and duties.
33	(a) It shall be the duty of the county board of education to supervise
34	and direct all of its employees in the performance of their duties.
35	(b) The county board's duties shall also include, but shall not be
36	limited to, the following:

- 1 (1) To cause to be set aside from funds in the county general
 2 school fund amounts necessary for the expenses of the county board and of any
 3 designee;
- 4 (2) To appoint new members when a vacancy occurs on the county
 5 board;
- 6 (3) To terminate the position of the county supervisor or county
 7 board designee;
- 8 (4) To abolish the county board upon the termination of the 9 county supervisor or county board designee; and
 - (5) To transfer to the respective county clerk, the respective county quorum court, the State Board of Workforce Education and Career Opportunities, the Department of Workforce Education, the State Board of Education, or the Department of Education, whichever may be appropriate, all records of the county board upon abolishment.
 - (c) In any county in which a county board is still in existence, the county board may enter into a written agreement with other county officials that would allow the county board or its employees to undertake any or all duties of county officials as they pertain to education or school districts administered in the county.

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6-12-307. Appeal - Bond.

- (a) Any person being a party to the record or proceeding in a matter brought before any county board of education who feels aggrieved by any final order or decision of the county board may prosecute an appeal from any final order or decision, provided the person shall within thirty (30) days from the date of the final order or decision complained of:
- (1) Make an affidavit that the appeal taken from the final order or decision of the county board is not taken for the purpose of delay; and
- (2) Enter into a bond with good and sufficient surety thereon in the sum as shall be ordered by the county board, not to exceed twice the amount involved in the appeal. Where no money or property is involved in the proceeding from which the appeal is prosecuted, the appeal bond should be given by the appellant in a sum that will protect the appellee and the county board from payment of cost, which amount shall be endorsed by the secretary of the county board on the affidavit of the appellant in a sum to be fixed by the county board.

1	(b) The appeal herein provided shall be to the circuit court of the
2	district or division in which the county board shall be sitting at the time
3	of the final decision or order complained of.
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5	6-12-308. Credentials.
6	(a)(1) If a county had a full-time county school supervisor or county
7	board of education designee on January 1, 1999, who was not employed more
8	than fifty percent (50%) of the time in other employment or duties other than
9	as county school supervisor or county board of education designee, the county
10	board may continue to employ that person to be county school supervisor or
11	county board designee; and
12	(2)(A) The county board may contract with that person for
13	service for a term of one (1) or two (2) years, subject to reemployment,
14	provided that no spouse of a member of the county board nor any person
15	related within the fourth degree of consanguinity or affinity to any member
16	of the county board shall be eligible for employment.
17	(B) Any employment contract between the county and a
18	county school supervisor or county board designee shall contain a provision
19	to allow termination of the contract without penalty if the position is
20	terminated because the county board is abolished.
21	(b) The county boards of education shall have the power and authority
22	to abolish the office of the county school supervisor or county board
23	designee in their respective counties.
24	(c) Upon the termination of employment of the county school supervisor
25	or county board designee whose employment was continued pursuant to the
26	conditions set forth in subsection (a) of this section or upon the
27	abolishment of the office of the county school supervisor or county board
28	designee in their respective counties, the county board shall not replace the
29	county school supervisor or county board designee, and the county board of
30	education shall be abolished.
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32	6-12-309. Duties of county school supervisor or county board of
33	education designee.
34	The county school supervisor or county board of education designee
35	shall devote his or her entire time to the position of county school
36	supervisor or county board designee, which position includes the faithful

1 performance of the following duties and other duties as may be properly 2 delegated to the supervisor or designee: 3 (1) The county school supervisor or county board designee shall be the 4 executive officer of the county board and shall, if possible, attend all 5 meetings of the county board but shall not have the right to vote; 6 (2) As ex officio secretary of the county board, the county 7 school supervisor or county board designee shall: 8 (A) Keep a record of all meetings and of all business 9 transactions of the county board and shall, together with the chair of the 10 board, sign the record at the close of each business meeting; 11 (B)(i) Keep a permanent copy of the record of the county 12 board meetings and prepare a copy to be filed with the county clerk and kept by the county clerk in the same manner in which the county school supervisor 13 14 or county board designee is required to keep the permanent records of the 15 county. 16 (ii) The clerk shall be entitled to no fee for the 17 filing or keeping of the record; and 18 (C) Keep a permanent file of all necessary papers and 19 legal transactions of the county board and, when called upon to do so, shall 20 furnish anyone entitled thereto a certified copy of the file; 21 (3) The county school supervisor or county board designee shall 22 record the certificates of teachers as required by law; 23 (4) The county school supervisor or county board designee shall 24 be a representative of the State Board of Education and shall perform duties 25 as may be required by the state board; 26 (5) The county school supervisor or county board designee shall 27 keep a record of the contracts made with teachers; 28 (6) The county school supervisor or county board designee shall 29 cooperate with the Department of Education in carrying out the budgetary 30 regulations and procedures pertaining to county boards of education as are 31 now, or may hereafter be, prescribed by the state board or by law; and 32 (7) The county school supervisor or county board designee may 33 keep in the county school supervisor's or county board designee's office and file with the Board of Trustees of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System and 34 35 the State Board of Education not later than October 15 of each year a list of 36 all teachers employed in the county for the ensuing year, setting forth the

type of certificate held by each teacher, the teacher's monthly contract salary, whether the teacher is a member of the system, and other information as the state board may deem necessary.

6-12-310. Failure to perform duties.

The failure of the county school supervisor or county board of education designee to perform any duties provided by law or any which may be imposed upon the county school supervisor or county board designee by the county board shall be sufficient cause for the county school supervisor's or county board designee's discharge and the termination of the county school supervisor's or county board designee's contract.

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6-12-311. Salary.

- (a) Each county board of education is authorized to determine, at its discretion, the salary of the county school supervisor or county board of education designee and allowances for travel, clerical, office, and other expenses.
- (b) For this purpose, the chair shall call a meeting in June each year for the consideration of these matters.
 - (c) All allowances for office expense, travel, and clerical help shall be based upon detailed budgets submitted by the county school supervisor or county board designee and approved by the county board.
 - (d) With the approval of the county board, the county school supervisor or county board designee is authorized to select clerical and other assistants as are necessary.
 - (e) The allowances to the county school supervisor or county board designee and members of the county board for travel expense, meals, and hotels shall not be in excess of the allowance for state employees.
 - (f) All funds provided in this section shall be set aside from the unapportioned county general school fund to a special fund by the county treasurer. Payments from this special fund shall be made only upon presentation of invoice statements, itemized expense accounts, and payrolls upon vouchers signed by the county school supervisor or county board designee and the chairman of the county board when vouchers properly executed are presented to the county clerk and approved by the county school supervisor or county board designee and the chairman of the county board.

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2	6-12-312. Spouse as employee.
3	No spouse of any member of the county board of education or of the
4	county school supervisor or county board designee nor any person related
5	within the fourth degree of consanguinity or affinity to any member of the
6	county board or to the county school supervisor or county board designee
7	shall be eligible for employment as clerical help in the office of the county
8	school supervisor or county board designee.
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10	6-12-313. Candidacy for public office.
11	The county school supervisor or county board of education designee
12	shall not be a candidate for public office during the term of the county
13	school supervisor's or county board designee's contract and shall not be
14	granted leave of absence for that purpose.
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16	6-12-314. Office at county seat.
17	The quorum court shall supply the county school supervisor or county
18	board of education designee with a suitably equipped office at the county
19	seat.
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
