33	(b) Beginning with the 2004-2005 school year, all school districts
34	shall have no less than the full-time equivalent of one (1) school nurse per
35	seven hundred and fifty (750) students or the proportionate ratio thereof.
36	(c) School nurses may be employed or provided by contract or agreement

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1	with other agencies or individuals provided that the prescribed ratio and
2	equivalency are maintained. Provided, however, no school nurse may be
3	employed by, or contract with, any public secondary or elementary school of
4	this state except with the prior approval of the local school board.
5	(d) In districts having a high concentration of children with
6	disabling conditions as determined by the State Board of Education, the ratio
7	of school nurses to students should be one (1) to four hundred (400) in those
8	schools so designated.
9	(e) In a district which provides a center for profoundly disabled
10	students, the ratio should be one (1) school nurse per one hundred twenty-
11	five (125) students at that center.
12	(f) For purposes of this section, a "school nurse" shall mean a
13	licensed nurse engaging in school nursing activities.
14	(g)(1) The provisions of this section shall only be effective upon the
15	availability of state funds.
16	(2) Available funds shall be distributed to school districts
17	based on the previous year's three-quarter average daily membership.
