9	MOURNING THE DEATH OF JAMES T. WHITEHEAD AND
10	HONORING HIM AS A CHAMPION OF EDUCATION.

13	MOURNING THE DEATH OF JAMES T. WHITEHEAD
14	AND HONORING HIM AS A CHAMPION OF
15	EDUCATION.

18	WHEREAS, the accomplished writer, poet, and teacher, James T. Whitehead
19	of Fayetteville, Arkansas died Friday, August 15, 2003, at the age of sixty-
20	seven (67); and
21	
22	WHEREAS, Mr. Whitehead was born in St. Louis, Missouri, on March 15,
23	1936, grew up in Jackson, Mississippi, and stood six feet five inches (6'5")
24	tall by the time he went to Vanderbilt University on a football scholarship,
25	where he met William Harrison, the budding writer who became his life-long
26	friend and associate; and
27	
28	WHEREAS, as a student Mr. Whitehead had a keen intellect, a firm sense
29	of justice on the race issue that was roiling the South at the time, and a
30	fully formed ferocity on a broad range of thought from the painting of
31	Vermeer to the theology of St. Augustine; and
32	
33	WHEREAS, Mr. Whitehead left Vanderbilt with a bachelor's degree in
34	philosophy and a master's degree in English, graduated from the Creative
35	Writing Program at the University of Iowa, and then joined William Harrison
36	to found a similar program at the University of Arkansas; and

2	WHEREAS, at the University of Arkansas Mr. Whitehead began a love
3	affair with all things "Razorback" and was one of the most ardent supporters
4	of both men and women's athletic programs; and
5	
6	WHEREAS, the Master of Fine Arts Program Mr. Whitehead established at
7	the University of Arkansas in conjunction with his friend and poet, Miller
8	Williams, became one of the nation's most acclaimed, with students including
9	Barry Hannah, Ellen Gilchrist, and others who have made their mark in
10	fiction, poetry, translation, and film; and
11	
12	WHEREAS, in 1971, Mr. Whitehead, then a poet and teacher at the
13	University of Arkansas, published the story of Sonny Joiner, an oversized
14	former football player and a man of excesses, intellectual and otherwise,
15	passionate about history, theological discourse, painting, politics,
16	quarreling, literature, and sports much like himself; and
17	
18	WHEREAS, this coming-of-age novel "Joiner", Mr. Whitehead's only
19	published novel, about segregationist Mississippi has received critical
20	acclaim; and
21	
22	WHEREAS, Mr. Whitehead, known as a skilled sonneteer favoring a
23	conversational style that drew on his affection for the country Southerner,
24	also published four (4) books of poetry, namely "Domains", "Local Men",
25	"Actual Size", and "Near Hand",
26	
27	NOW THEREFORE,
28	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-FOURTH GENERAL
29	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
30	
31	THAT the House of Representatives mourns the passing of James T.
32	Whitehead, and honors his years of service to the state and community as a
33	writer, poet, teacher, and champion of education.
