20 WHEREAS, Dr. Donald Bay Baker of Fayetteville, the son of Virgil L. and
21 Lillian Bay Baker, born August 31, 1928, in Urbana, Illinois, died on Friday,
22 December 12, 2003, at the age of 75; and

24 WHEREAS, Dr. Baker was universally loved, respected, and admired as a
25 kind, benevolent, family physician who touched the lives of numerous families
26 in the Fayetteville community; and

28 WHEREAS, after receiving his Doctor of Medicine from the University of
29 Arkansas, Dr. Baker served in the Air Force from 1953 to 1956, returning to
30 Fayetteville to practice family medicine in 1957; and

32 WHEREAS, during his years of practice, Dr. Baker was associated with
33 Doctors Jim Patrick, Carrie Buckley, and Lee Parker at the Doctors' Building;
34 served as Chief of Staff at Fayetteville City Hospital and Washington
35 Regional Medical Center; and as President of the Washington County Medical

WHEREAS, Dr. Baker was a Fellow of the College of Quality Assurance and Utilization Review and served as a member and physician advisor to the Arkansas Foundation for Medical Care; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Baker was devoted to the staff of Washington Regional Medical Center, serving twice as a member of the hospital's Board of Governors and being honored by the hospital in 1981 when its conference center was named after him; and

WHEREAS, in 1988, Dr. Baker closed his private practice and joined the administrative team at Washington Regional Medical Center, becoming the first medical director of the hospital; and

WHEREAS, following his retirement, Dr. Baker received the Eagle Award for his outstanding contribution to health care in Northwest Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Baker served as Chairman of the Board of Directors for Abilities Unlimited and was a life-long member and elder of the First United Presbyterian Church; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Baker was truly loved by his devoted patients and their families as a trusted advisor, physician, and friend,
